Just Briefly

The Loyola Marymount men's soccer team, currently ranked eighth in the Far West by the National Soccer Coaches' Association of America, concludes its 2000 regular season this Saturday looking to keep its NCAA Tournament hopes alive. The Lions suffered a setback in their quest for postseason play on Sunday, Nov. 5 with a tough 1-0 home loss to West Coast Conference foe Gonzaga at Sullivan Field, snapping a four-game unbeaten streak. Senior Brian Ching scored the game-winning goal for the Bulldogs at the 52:37 mark off a long header. Meanwhile GU sophomore Mike McCarthy was solid in goal, turning back 11 LMU attempts including a penalty kick by sophomore forward Arturo Torres, the WCC Player of the Month for October, in the 69th minute. Loyola Marymount was the aggressor with a 17-7 shot advantage in this physical contest, in which one red and nine yellow cards were issued. Sunday's game marked the final home contest in the careers of LMU seniors Jaret Asuncion, Jerad Bailey and Spencer Reeves.

Up Next

The Lions travel to WCC foe Santa Clara on Saturday, Nov. 11 for a 7:30 p.m. show-down which will wrap up their 2000 regular season. LMU will then play the waiting game to see if it is awarded an at-large birth to the 2000 NCAA Tournament. The 32-team field will be announced on Monday, November 13 at 3:30 p.m. PST. The selection show can be viewed live on Fox Sports Net South (DirecTV Channel 630).

Lions in the Midst of Record-Setting Season

The Lions' 10 victories in 2000 have established a new school record for wins in a season. The previous best came in 1981, when Loyola Marymount posted a record of 9-4-0 and won the Southern California Intrecollegiate Soccer Association title. LMU also set an important attendance mark this season, as a capacity and record crowd of 917 fans watched the Lions upset eighth-ranked Portland on Oct. 22 at Sullivan Field. In addition, a win ove Santa Clara on Saturday will equal the school record of three victories in West Coast Conference play, achieved in both 1997 and 1998.

Comeback Kids

Formerly dubbed the "Cardiac Kids" because of their undefeated 6-0-1 mark in overtime this season, the Lions have earned their new moniker by rallying from behind in three of their past five games, all victories. After Saint Mary's scored a goal in the opening minutes on Oct. 8, Spencer Reeves and Eric Kim found the back of the cage to give Loyola Marymount its first WCC win of the year. Then on Oct. 22 leads of 1-0 and 2-1 weren't big enough for eighth-ranked Portland as freshman Kevin Novak notched the game-tying score and "golden goal" in overtime to give LMU its biggest win this season. Against Cal State Northridge the Lions recovered from an early miscue to score two unanswered goals, the second coming from Arturo Torres at the 87:47 mark. Earlier in the season LMU rallied from two-goal deficits at UNLV (Sept. 8) and against UCI (Sept. 29) for OT victories.

Torres Tops the Charts

Only a sophomore, forward Arturo Torres already holds a combined five single-season and career Loyola Marymount scoring records. Most recently he established new Lion highwater marks for career points and assists in a season against Portland. The only record remaining on Torres' hit list is the all-time mark of 15 assists, which he is only one shy of tying. The Wilmington, Calif., native currently leads the WCC in assists with 11 this season, and ranks third in points with 32, however his 10 points in conference games are more than any other player. The reigning West Coast Conference Player of the Month has scored or assisted on 21 of Loyola Marymount's 26 goals and has tallied three or more points in six different games this season.

Protecting the Pride

Senior Jerad Bailey has been the busiest goalkeeper in the country this season, leading all Division I players with 105 saves. That equates to 7.00 saves per game, fourth-best nationally. While Bailey has faced a ton of shots he hasn't let many through, boasting a goals against average of 1.41 - over half a goal lower than his 1999 mark. The Redlands, Calif., native has already matched his previous career high for shutouts in a single season with four in 2000. The Lion defense as a whole has stepped up this year, allowing just 23 goals (1.35 per game).

LMU Head Coach

Paul Krumpe is in his third season at the helm of the LMU men's soccer program. In 1999 he guided the Lions to their best overall record (8-8-3) in nearly twenty years and earned WCC Coach of the Year honors. A 1986 graduate of UCLA, Krumpe came to LMU after spending three seasons as an assistant with the Bruins. During those seasons, he helped lead UCLA to a record of 56-9-1, three NCAA regional appearances, three Mountain Pacific Sports Federation titles and a national championship in 1997. As a player for UCLA, Krumpe was a four-year starter (1982-85), co-captain of the 1985 NCAA Championship team and a two-time All-Far West Region selection. He also has extensive international experience, playing in over 40 games with Team USA including the 1988 Summer Olympics.

Scouting the Broncos

Following last season's appearance in the NCAA Championship game, Santa Clara has posted a modest record of 8-7-0 overall and 2-2-0 in WCC play. The Broncos will host San Francisco on Tuesday evening before taking on the Lions on Saturday. Junior forward Anthony Chimienti has been the most offensive SCU player with 13 points, while sophomore defender Jamil Walker is right behind him with 11. LMU also closed the 1999 regular season against Santa Clara as the two teams played to a 1-1 tie at Sullivan Field. The Broncos lead the all-time series 13-2-1.
