QUICKLY

The Lions' four-game road swing will conclude with two trips to the Mountain Time Zone with a game against the Buffalos of the University of Colorado on Tuesday, Nov. 28 at the Coors Event Center and then a trip to Pocatello, Idaho, with a match against the Bengals of Idaho State University on Saturday, Dec. 2 at the Holt Arena. It is the first of two four-game road trips of the 2000-01 season, as the Lions will take another four-game trip from Feb. 8-17 in West Coast Conference play. The Lions opened up the season and the Steve Aggers campaign with a victory at Gersten Pavilion, 87-64 over Vanguard University, the dropped a heartbreaker to open up the road trip to UC Irvine 62-57 and then a 91-68 loss to #20 USC.

GAME #4

The Lions and the Buffalos have tangled twice, with Colorado defeating LMU 82-77 in Boulder in 1982 and the Lions getting revenge at Gersten Pavilion in 1985 with a 80-71 win. The Buffs sit at 2-2 heading into the game against the Lions. Under head coach Ricardo Patton, the Buffs are 18-6 in the month of November. Led by junior forward D.J. Harrison with more than 20 points per game, the Buffs average more than 88 points a contest. Forward Jamahl Mosley is the senior leader of CU, averaging 19 points and more than eight rebounds on the season. The Buffs fell to St. Joseph's in their home opener on Sunday, Nov. 26, 92-78.

GAME #5

The Bengals enter the week at 1-1 with a game against Utah State at Holt Arena on Nov. 29. Idaho State started the season with a 71-65 loss at #12 Utah. It was the first meeting with a nationally ranked team in 13 years. On Nov. 25 they fell 82-64 to Southern Utah. Idaho State, a member of the Big Sky Conference, is led by head coach Doug Oliver,

who in his fourth season with a record of 15-41. Oliver and LMU Head Coach Steve Aggers are no strangers to one another. Aggers holds a 3-1 record in head-to-head competition against Oliver. Overall the Lions hold a 2-1 advantage over the Bengals, winning their last meeting in 1990, 114-110.

LAST WEEK

GAME #2

The Lions began their four-game road trip hoping to snap a 19-game road losing streak against the Big West's UC Irvine. The Lions, despite a comeback effort, fell to the Anteaters, 62-57 at the Bren Event Center. The Lions fell behind by 10, 31-21, at the half after going 8-for-29 from the field (27 percent). Including the two exhibition wins, it was the worst shooting percentage in the Lions' first three games. LMU managed to cut the lead to two halfway through the second thanks to a pair of Pablo Machado free throws and three-pointers from Eurskine Robinson and Philipp Czernin. The 'Eaters used a flawless offense the last half of the game to hold on to the win. Robinson led the Lions with 11 points, five rebounds, five assists and a steal. Junior Robert Davis also finished in double figures with 10 points. For the second straight game the Lions held the edge in rebounding, 38-35 despite facing two seven footers for UC Irvine. Senior Elton Mashack had nine boards and junior Greg Lakey had eight.

GAME #3 - USC

The Lions' adventures on the road have not been of the friendly kind, and heading into 20th ranked USC, it didn't get much better. Loyola Marymount men's basketball fell to Southern California at the Los Angeles Sports Arena 91-68. The Lions (1-2) fell behind early, trailing 47-34 and could not recover from the Trojans' 50 percent shooting from the three-point line. USC finished the game hitting 12-of-24 from long range, including a seven-of-11 clip (63 percent) in the second half. Both junior Greg Lakey and senior Pablo Machado fouled out of the game for the Lions, who finished with 22 fouls on the game compared to USC's 12. The Trojans finished the game hitting 21-of-27 from the charity stripe and the Lions finished nine-of-14. Junior Robert Davis, who played at LMU as a freshman and transferred to Chandler Gilbert Junior College last year before returning to the Lions, finished the game with 21 points, breaking a career high of 17 he scored against UCLA on Dec. 29, 1998. Davis finished the game hitting nine-of-15 from the field, including two-of-five from the three-point line. USC's Brian Scalabrine finished the game with a game-high 22 points on six-of-11 shooting, including an eight-of-10 effort from the free throw line. Senior Elton Mashack finished with 15 points and eight rebounds and junior Eurskine Robinson finished with 11 points and three rebounds.

Head Coach Steve Aggers



Steve Aggers enters his first season as head coach of the Loyola Marymount men's basketball program, the 22nd head coach in the history of the program. Aggers comes from Eastern Washington University where he had a phenomenal five-year run, guiding the Eagles to its first Big Sky Conference title in school history. Aggers was named Big Sky Coach of the Year and the National Association of Basketball Coaches' District 13 Coach of the Year.

The winner of more Big Sky Conference games than any other coach in Eastern Washington University history, Aggers led the Eagles to 32 conference wins in the past four seasons. Since joining the Big Sky in 1984, EWU had won only 34 conference games combined. Aggers took the Eagle basketball program to new levels, as the team rose from a power ranking of No. 298 to No. 106 in 1999-2000.

"I am extremely thankful for the opportunity I've been given and I see this as a new beginning and a fresh start," said Aggers, who was hired in April of 2000. "My staff and I are looking forward toward a very bright and dynamic future. One of the reasons I accepted this job was the location of the institution, its proud past with a rich athletic tradition, strong academic reputation and the outstanding recruiting base it provides. Our goals and objectives are not to just be competitive, but to build a championship program."

Aggers entered the 2000-2001 season with a mark of 315-269, and as currently sits at 316-271 in his first season at LMU. He returns to the West Coast Conference where he served as an assistant with Pepperdine for four years (1990-1994). He has been coaching on the collegiate level for 26 years.

COACHES' COMMENTS

...on the effort... "Our team has definitely improved over the past three games. The defensive effort was much improved since our opener against Vanguard but suffered against USC. We did not defend the perimeter well against USC."

...fouls... "We got into four trouble early against USC with our guys up front and had to go to more zone with the smaller line-up. We did not defend well on the perimeter and they hit their shots. We have to get better at defending the perimeter and keep our big guys out of foul trouble."

...getting to the line... "We have to find a way to get to the free throw line more. We have to play much more aggressive on offense and give ourselves more opportunities while keeping our big guys out of foul trouble. We have no depth up front and cannot afford to play with a lot of fouls."

...playing within the system... "We have to control the pace. Against the Trojans we wanted to keep them to 65-70 points and ended up allowing 91. We failed at executing the game plan. We allowed them to get into quick spurts and get into their style of play. We have to learn how to stay within the game plan. We will not be able to defeat teams relying strictly on talent. We have to play within our game plan to be successful."

...turnovers... "At this time of the season we will accept anything under 15 turnovers. We had 17 in the game against USC compared to their nine. We will not be able to win many games with a ratio like that. I was disappointed with the loss to USC because of the way we played. We cannot play outside ourselves. Again, we have to play within the system and that will help limit the turnovers. We played in the system spuratically, but not consistent enough to win us ball games."

Hard Court Notes

BALANCED DIET

The Lions threw a balanced attack on the court against Vanguard in their season opener and again against USC. All 11 on the active roster received playing time for the Lions against Vanguard, including nine players with more than 10 minutes. In addition, five players earned double figures in scoring and nine finished with at least two points. It is the first time the Lions had five score in double figures since back-to-back games against Pepperdine in the 1998-99 season when six Lions scored in double figures. The team effort also translated to 32 points off 19 turnovers by Vanguard. LMU also had an 18-6 advantage in second chance points, out rebounding Vanguard 37-22. Against USC, 10 of 11 players earned more than 11 minutes of playing time with three in double figures in scoring.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

The Lions have lost 21 straight games on the road as they conclude their last half of this current four-game road trip. The Lions will have another four-game road trip in the middle of West Coast Conference play in February.

MORE SHOOTING

Against Vanguard the Lions didn't get off to a bad start, finishing the game hitting 59 percent of their shots. It was the first game since hitting 37-of-58 (.638) in a 101-87 win over St. Mary's on January 29, 1999, the Lions finished a regular season game hitting more than 50 percent of their field goals. In the 87-64 win over Vanguard, the Lions hit 70 percent in the first half, including 4-of-7 from the three point line. The last time the Lions lost a game in which they shot over 50 percent came against Boise State on Nov. 21, 1998, when the Lions hit 25-of-44 in a 93-86 loss in

Gersten Pavilion. It was much tougher against UC Irvine, as the Lions started the first quarter hitting only 27 percent of its shots to finish the game hitting 38 percent (22-of-57). The Lions sit at .485 (81-of-167) on the season after a 48 percent effort (including 51.9 percent in the first half) against USC.

SENIOR LEADER

Senior Elton Mashack is the team captain of the Lions and is expected to be the leader of the team this season. As the season progresses, he might be one of the all-time leaders at LMU. With 811 points and 375 rebounds in three years at Loyola Marymount, Mashack could join an elite list of only 10 players that have accomplished the feat of scoring 1,000 points and grabbing 500 rebounds in a career. He has 36 points and 24 rebounds on the season, giving him **847 points** and **399 rebounds** in his career at LMU. To put it in perspective, in 1999-2000, Mashack finished with a roller coaster year, but managed 307 points (11.4 ppg) and 191 rebounds (7.1 rpg).

MORE FOR MASHACK

Mashack, who has 11 double-doubles in his previous three years at Loyola Marymount, earned an unofficial one in the final exhibition game of his career and the Lion's 2000-01 season. In the 99-71 win over Son's Blue Angels, the forward scored 18 points and had 10 rebounds. The double-double record of 66 by Jim Haderlein is far from attainable for Mashack. He just missed a double-double against USC with 15 points and eight boards.

MAKE THAT A DOUBLE

After seeing his first action in over a year since transferring to LMU from USC a year ago, junior **Greg Lakey** earned his first career double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds in the Lions 87-64 win over Vanguard. So far this season, Lakey is averaging 8.0 points and 6.3 rebounds per game. As a junior, Lakey has begun to take some of the leadership on the floor for the Lions, as he and senior Pablo Machado will get the majority of the playing time at the center position for the smaller LMU line-up. The leadership is no surprise for Lakey, who has a son, Tahj. Lakey averaged 5.1 points per game in two seasons with USC, earning 19

starts his freshman season in 1997-98.

ON THE COURT AGAIN

Junior **Philipp Czernin** also enjoyed his time back on the court after transferring and redshirting the 1999-2000 season. Coming from the University of Hawai'i where he averaged 5.9 points in starting 16 of 28 games in Honolulu, Czernin earned 13 points, four rebounds and three assists in 25 minutes in the season opener. He is tied for fifth on the team in scoring with eight points per game and has five assists on the season. His clutch free throw shooting started where he left off in exhibition hitting 6-of-7 from the charity stripe on the season.

ON THE BOARDS

Despite the smaller line-up of the Lions, who have only two players over 6-8, they hold a +4.3 edge on the boards after three games of the 2000-01 season. The first two games saw the Lions dominate the glass, outrebounding a much taller UC Irvine squad, who features two 7-footers, 38-35 and Vanguard 37-24. It took the 20th ranked team in the nation to out-do the Lions. The Trojans took advantage of the Lions' two big men fouling out of the game to take a 34-31 rebounding edge on the Lions. On the season, the Lions are led by senior **Elton Mashack** with a total of 24 boards in three games. His total includes 12 offensive and 12 defensive, for an average of eight rebounds per game.

WELCOME BACK

Loyola Marymount welcomed back the services of junior **Robert Davis**. The 6-2 guard from Tempe, Ariz., began his collegiate career at LMU in 1998-99 where he averaged 7.1 points and 2.3 rebounds a game as a true freshman. Last year Davis transferred to Chandler Gilbert Junior College where he led the conference with 26.2 points per game. In his first game back, Davis managed 11 points for the Lions, including two three pointers. After three games he leads the team with a 14.0 ppg average, including a season high 21 points in the loss to USC. Davis enjoys playing the powers of Southern California, as his previous high of 17 came against UCLA in his freshman season on Dec. 29, 1998. Davis is also averaging 2.7 rebounds per game and has six assists and a steal. More leading stats - he leads the team with six three-pointers in 17 attempts (.353). He is shooting 47 percent from the field (16-of-34) and 80 percent from the free throw line (4-of-5)

IN THE MIDDLE

Senior center **Pablo Machado** enters his fourth and final season of collegiate basketball. Prior to transferring from Georgia Tech two years ago to LMU, Machado was one of the top-rated high school players in the nation coming out of Tift County High School in 1996. At 6-10, Machado was named "Mr. Basketball" in Georgia by the Atlanta Journal-Constitution. Hoping to return to his high school stats, where he averaged 22 points and 12 rebounds, Machado had a solid start with 19 points and seven rebounds vs. Vanguard. Although hampered by four fouls most of the second half, Machado had his way with the smaller line-up of Vanguard. Fouls have been a problem for Machado this early 2000-01 campaign. He has picked up 11 in three games and fouled out of the USC game. However, he has begun to lift up his game, as the Venezuela native is second on the team with 12 points per game and is third with 4.7 rebounds per game.

A GOOD DISH

Juniors **Tyler McClenahan** and **Euskine Robinson** will be the key at the point for the Lions this season. Robinson, who transferred from College of the Canyons, earned the starting nod and delivered for the Lions, averaging the most minutes of any Lion with a 31.3 per game average. He has delivered with 11 assists on the season and four steals, both team highs. His replacement, senior walk-on McClenahan was a pleasant surprise for the Lions, as he has stepped up and earned valuable

playing time in back-up of Robinson. He earned an average of just over eight minutes per game while dishing out seven assists and only three turnovers. Robinson, who broke College of the Canyons' career assist record with 421, added two steals for the Lions. LMU finished the game against Vanguard with 21 assists, the highest assist total for the Lions since they had 25 against St. Mary's on Jan. 29, 1999 in a 101-87 win.
