### LMU (8-5-1, 1-1-1 WCC) vs. Portland (8-2-2, 0-1-0 WCC)

#### Just Briefly

The Loyola Marymount men's soccer team, currently ranked ninth in the Far West by the National Soccer Coaches' Association of America, continues its four-game homestand this Sunday with another important West Coast Conference showdown. The Lions are coming off a hard-fought 2-2 tie with 20th-ranked San Diego last Sunday, Oct. 14 at Sullivan Field. At the 10:23 mark sophomore forward Arturo Torres put LMU ahead 1-0 and established a new school record for goals by scoring for the 24th time in his young collegiate career. After a first-half Torrero goal, Torres again put the home team ahead and tied the LMU record for career points (61) on a penalty kick in the 63rd minute. However USD's Tyler Conley scored what turned out to be the game's final goal at the 82:41 mark. Torres, who earned conference Player of the Week honors for his efforts, had a golden opportunity to end the WCC contest and pull off a major upset in the 99th minute, however his attempt from close range hit the underside of the crossbar. The Lions' next victory will be their ninth in 2000, tying the school record for wins in a season.

#### Up Next

LMU does battle with its second nationally-ranked conference foe in as many weeks when Portland, currently eighth in the Soccer America poll, visits Sullivan Field on Sunday, Oct. 22 for a 3:00 p.m. contest. Looking ahead, the Lions play their final nonconference game of the season on Sunday, Oct. 29 against Cal State Northridge at 2:00 p.m.

### Lions on the Verge of Something Special

With a record of 8-5-1, Loyola Marymount is just one win shy of matching the school record for victories in a season, set in 1981 when the Lions went 9-4-0 and placed first in the Southern California Intercollegiate Soccer Association. Since that time LMU's best season came in 1999 when it finished at 8-8-3 overall. In addition, one more victory in WCC play will equal the Lions' entire conference win total from last season.

### Cardiac Kids

Sudden death has meant sudden victory for the Lions, who are an undefeated 5-0-1 in overtime games this season. In addition to last Sunday's tie against San Diego, LMU recently made its fans' hair turn grey with three OT contests in an eight-day span. On Sept. 23 junior Claudio Basaez stuck a dagger through San Diego State's collective heart by scoring in the 111th minute during the second sudden-death period. Then on Sept. 26 LMU and UC Santa Barbara played 118 minutes of scoreless soccer before Arturo Torres netted the game winner with less than two minutes remaining in the second OT period. The third overtime nail-biter occurred on Sept. 29 when Andres Murriagui scored at the 96:20 mark to cap a three-goal rally against UC Irvine. LMU also recorded consecutive OT wins against Loyola Chicago (Sept. 3) and UNLV (Sept. 8). The Lions have obviously learned their lesson from 1999, when they posted an 0-2-3 record in overtime contests.

### Two Records Down, One to Go for Torres

Having already shattered single season LMU scoring records during his sensational rookie season in 1999, forward Arturo Torres has begun his assault on the school's career record books as a sophomore. Against San Diego Torres recorded his 24th career goal in just his 32nd collegiate game, surpassing the highwater mark of 23 established by Jorge Rodriguez, who played for the Lions from 1993 to 1996. His second goal against USD on Sunday tied the Wilmington, Calif., native for the LMU career points record (61), also set by Rodriguez. Next on Torres' hit list is the all-time record of 15 assists, which he is four shy of. Torres, the reigning WCC Player of the week, currently ranks third in the conference this season in both goals (9) and points (25).

### Protecting the Pride

Senior Jerad Bailey has been the busiest goalkeeper in the country this season, leading all Division I players with 91 saves. That equates to 7.00 saves per game, fourth-best nationally. While Bailey has faced a ton of shots he hasn't let many through, boasting a goals against average of 1.41 - over half a goal lower than his 1999 mark. Just 14 games into the 2000 campaign the Redlands, Calif., native has already matched his previous career high for shutouts in a single season with four. Bailey has blanked a school-record 14 opponents in his LMU career. The Lion defense as a whole has stepped up this year, allowing just 19 goals (1.36 per game). Loyola Marymount is particularly stingy in the second half of games, surrendering just five scores and 85 shots.

### LMU Head Coach

Paul Krumpke enters his third season at the helm of the LMU men's soccer program. In 1999 he guided the Lions to their best overall record (8-8-3) in nearly twenty years and earned WCC Coach of the Year honors. A 1986 graduate of UCLA, Krumpke came to LMU after spending three seasons as an assistant with the Bruins. During those seasons, he helped lead UCLA to a record of 56-9-1, three NCAA regional appearances, three Mountain Pacific Sports Federation titles and a national championship in 1997. As a player for UCLA, Krumpke was a four year starter (1982-85), co-captain of the 1985 NCAA Championship team and a two-time All-Far West Region selection. He also has extensive international experience, playing in over 40 games with Team USA including the 1988 Summer Olympics.

### Pilot Points of Interest

Portland comes to Westchester looking to eradicate the bitter taste of a 2-0 home upset at the hands of Santa Clara last Sunday in its WCC opener. The Pilots, led by 2000 U.S. Olympic Team Coach Clive Charles, are paced in scoring by freshman Nate Jacqua (20 points) and also feature 1999 conference co-Player of the Year Connor Casey. Loyola Marymount played UP, a 1999 NCAA Tournament participant, to a 2-2 tie in Portland last season.
