UP NEXT...The Loyola Marymount women's basketball team gets ready to host Saint Mary's and San Francisco in West Coast Conference action this weekend. On Friday, Jan. 26 the Lions match-up against the Gaels who are off to a hot start at 4-0 in WCC play. The San Francisco Lady Dons will be in town on Saturday, Jan. 27; both contests are scheduled for a 7 p.m. tip-off at Gersten Pavilion.

REYNOLDS RIDES THE WAVES...Senior guard Taryn Reynolds came to play in her final meeting with crosstown rival Pepperdine last week. The 5-7 native of Los Angeles, Calif. led the Lions to their first win over the Waves in over three years. Reynolds put up game-high point totals both nights against Pepperdine 19 coming on Wednesday night and a season-high 23 coming on Saturday. She led the team with a 21.0 points per game average for the weekend. Reynolds also recorded a season-high 16 field goal attempts both nights against the Waves. Reynolds currently leads the team averaging 13.9 points per game.

THREE-YEAR DROUGHT WASHED AWAY...The Lions 84-75 home win over Pepperdine last Wednesday ended a three-year winning drought for LMU. The last time the Lions posted a win over the Waves was the 1996-97 season. LMU defeated Pepperdine 72-68 at Gersten Pavilion before falling to the Waves, 54-58, three days later at Firestone Fieldhouse in Malibu, Calif. Senior guard Taryn Reynolds was a freshman that season, she is only current Lion have two career wins over the Waves.

ON FIRE...Despite Saturday's loss at Pepperdine the Lions are off to one of the best starts in program history. LMU has won seven of its last nine games which includes a season-best six-game winning streak. LMU's streak, which tied a program-high for consecutive wins, began December 22 with an 89-56 win over Western Michigan at the Seattle Times Classic and continued with wins over Northern Arizona (66-51), Pittsburgh (74-57), No. 25 Utah (64-58), Long Beach State (75-61) and San Diego (74-70). The Lions saw their streak snapped after falling 75-84 at Santa Clara, but came back to record their seventh win at home against Pepperdine.

PROTECTING THE LIONS' DEN...The Lions are very protective of their home court as they have posted a 6-1 mark while playing at Gersten Pavilion this season. The Lions are looking to extend their current 5-0 undefeated mark this weekend as they welcome Saint Mary's and San Francisco into the Lions' Den. LMU's longest home win streak in program history came during the 1992-93 season when the Lions rattled off 10 straight wins at Gersten Pavilion from Dec. 1, 1992-Jan. 30, 1993.

MURRAY HITS DOUBLE-DIGIT MARK...AGAIN...Sophomore forward Kate Murray has had a break out season so far setting career-highs in almost every category. Murray, who has scored in double figures in 15 of the 18 games played this year, had a career-best game against No. 23 Xavier earlier this season. Against the Musketeers Murray connected on 11-of-18 from field, pulled down 11 rebounds, had five steals and dropped 23 points in 39 minutes, all career-highs. Her 15 games in double-digit points leads the team. She also leads the Lions with three double-doubles on the year; Xavier - 11 rebounds, 23 points, Western Michigan - 10 rebounds, 13 points and Pittsburgh - 10 rebounds, 17 points. Murray was one five Lions to score in double-digits against Pepperdine last Wednesday night. She burned the Waves for 19 points tying for the game-high with teammate Taryn Reynolds.

MATTHEWS MATURES AGAINST THE WAVES...Freshman guard Jasmin Matthews has been a force off the bench recently for the Lions. Matthews played 21 minutes and scored six points against Santa Clara two weeks ago and had her best performance of the year last Wednesday night against Pepperdine. She has shown constant improvement and great maturity on the floor which resulted in the first double-double of her young career. Against the Waves Matthews pulled down 10 rebounds and dropped 10 points, both season-bests. Matthews was 2-of-6 from the field but more importantly put away 6-of-10 from the charity stripe while also nabbing two steals.

INJURY REPORT...The Lions will be without the services of sophomore center Shannon Wosman the rest of the season. Wosman will sit out the remainder of the year due to a torn ACL which she suffered during the game at Santa Clara two weeks ago. Wosman will undergo surgery in the off-season and with rehab looks to be back in full force next year.

TERRIFIC TUESDAYS AND FANTASTIC FRIDAYS...If it was up to the Lions, the rest of the games this season would be played on a Tuesdays and Fridays. LMU is perfect 3-0 this season when playing on Tuesdays. Wins over San Diego State, Fresno State and No.25 Utah have made midweek games ideal for the Lions. LMU has also posted a perfect 3-0 mark when playing games on Fridays. Victories over Stony Brook, Western Michigan and recently Long Beach State have started the Lions' weekends off on the right note.

RECAPING GAME 1 VS PEPPERDINE...The Loyola Marymount women's basketball team rolled to an 84-75 win over crosstown rival Pepperdine Wednesday night in Gersten Pavilion. Five Lions scored in double digits while sophomore Kate Murray and senior Taryn Reynolds each hit a game-high 19 points. The Lions, who improved to 11-5 overall and 2-1 in West Coast Conference action, trailed at the half 40-41. Murray was the high scorer at the half with nine points. The Waves, who fell to 11-7 overall and 1-2 in WCC action, enjoyed their largest lead of the game (26-20) at the 8:50 mark of the first half on a made three-pointer by Waves' guard Shandrika Lee. Lee finished the game with 11 points. LMU came back strong in the second half using the inside game to take the lead. The Lions dominated the Waves inside outscoring them 14-8 off points in the paint. LMU also took advantage of Pepperdine's turnovers scoring 14 points off Waves' mistakes. The Lions balanced offense proved to be too much for the Waves. Besides Murray and Reynolds three other Lions put up double-digit point figures; junior Bryn Britton tallied 17 points while freshmen Adrienne Slaughter and Jasmin Matthews each dropped 10 points. Matthews points marked a season-high for her. Her play off the bench proved to be key for LMU as she also had season-highs in minutes (30), rebounds (9) and steals (2).

RECAPING GAME 2 AT PEPPERDINE...Senior guard Taryn Reynolds dropped a season-high 23 points in the Lions' 62-77 loss to Pepperdine in a West Coast Conference (WCC) game Saturday night at Firestone Fieldhouse in Malibu. Pepperdine improved its record to 12-7 overall and 2-2 in WCC play, while LMU dropped to 11-6 on the season and 2-2 in conference action. After playing sub par defense and struggling at the free throw line in its earlier meeting with LMU, Pepperdine reversed its play as it used a strong defense and solid foul shooting to build an 18-point halftime lead and led by as many as 20 points in the second half. After the Lions jumped out to a quick 6-0 lead on three lay-ups by senior guard Reynolds, the Waves scored the next 11 points en route to a 25-2 to run in which they held LMU to just one field goal over the next 12:55. Pepperdine shot 48.3 percent (14 of 29) and made all five of its free throw attempts in the first half, while limiting LMU to just 26.7 percent (8 of 30) during the first 20 minutes of action. The Waves finished the game shooting 48.0 percent (24 of 50), while the Lions managed just 36.2 percent (21 of 58) from the field. Reynolds finished with a game and season-high 23 points, while sophomore forward Kate Murray and junior guard Bryn Britton each added 10 points for the Lions.

WILHOIT NAMED WCC COACH OF THE YEAR...Head Coach Julie Wilhoit captured the WCC Coach of the Year Award after guiding the Lions to their highest finish since 1990 last year. She is the first LMU women's basketball coach to earn the top coaching nod. Wilhoit is currently in her sixth season at the helm of the LMU women's basketball program. She was named the fourth head coach in the program's history on June 30, 1995. Wilhoit came to LMU after a two-year stint at the University of Pittsburgh-Bradford. With the Lions, she holds a 52-102 (.338) overall record and 19-61 (.238) record in West Coast Conference play. Wilhoit is in her 13th year as a head coach and owns a 173-172 (.501) overall record.

THE GOODS ON THE GAELS...Saint Mary's enters the weekend a perfect 4-0 in WCC play and 15-2 overall. The Gaels are led by Jerkisha and Jermisha Dosty. Jerkisha leads the offense with a 13.9 points per game average while Jermisha heads up the battle of the boards pulling down 10.8 rebounds per game. SMC leads the series with 25-4 advantage. LMU's last win against the Gaels came in 1993 with a 72-61 victory.

THE DISH ON THE DONS...San Francisco comes to Los Angeles with a 10-7 overall record and a 3-1 mark in WCC action. The Lady Dons are led offensively by Kim Whisler who is averaging 14.7 points per game. Whisler has been the key to USF winning five of their last six games. USF owns a 24-9 series advantage over LMU. The Lions' last win (80-68) came in overtime last season at Gersten Pavilion.
