UP NEXT...The Loyola Marymount women's basketball team enjoys a full week of rest before embarking on an eight day road trip. The Lions begin their journey on Monday, Dec. 18 in Waco, Tex. to face the Baylor Bears at 7 p.m. LMU then travels to the Pacific Northwest for its final tournament of the season. The Lions will face tournament host Washington on Thursday, Dec. 21 in day one of the Seattle Times Classic. Tip-off for the Lions and the Huskies is 8 p.m.

AN EARLY SLAUGHTER OF THE RECORD BOOKS...Freshman center Adrienne Slaughter has already etched her name into the LMU record books in just her sixth game as a Lion. The 6-foot-2 Englewood, Col. native picked up 17 points in LMU's 85-63 routing of Fresno State last week and in the process set a new school record with a perfect 7-for-7 performance from the field. Slaughter's perfection from the field (7-of-7) broke the old mark of 6-for-6 set first by assistant coach Lynn Flanagan against Arkansas (12/5/88) and matched by Jamie Jesko against Southern Utah State (12/20/88).

LIONS VS. FRESNO STATE RECAP...The Loyola Marymount women's basketball team rolled to an 85-63 win over Fresno State Tuesday night in Gersten Pavilion. The 22-point routing marks the largest margin of victory for the Lions this season. Freshman Adrienne Slaughter was one of five Lions to score in double-digits. The 6-foot-2 center tallied 17 points and set a new LMU mark with a perfect 7-for-7 performance from the field. The Lions, who improved to 4-2 overall, used Slaughter's 17-point effort to jump ahead 45-31 going into the locker room at the half. Slaughter's perfection from the field (7-of-7) broke the old mark of 6-for-6 set first by assistant coach Lynn Flanagan against Arkansas (12/5/88) and matched by Jamie Jesko against Southern Utah State (12/20/88). LMU's attack came from all sides as five Lions scored in double-digits. Junior guard Bryn Britton led the way with 19 points, a game-high, six rebounds and three steals. She was followed by Slaughter's 17 points, five boards and three steals while sophomore Kate Murray and senior Taryn Reynolds scored 11 and 10 points, respectively. Junior guard Rosa Bernasconi eagerly jumped back into the action after being sidelined for the past six weeks with a broken hand. She made an immediate impact adding in 14 points,

dishing out a game-high seven assists and being the leading thief of the night with four steals. Fresno State (2-3 Overall) fell behind early as they saw the Lions go on a 10-0 run to start the game. The Bulldogs were able to come within two points cutting LMU's lead to 12-10 but could not go further as the Lions turned up the heat and went on a 14-2 run to extend the lead again. Two points would be as close as FSU could come all game as they saw the Lions go up by as many as 29 late in the game. Laura Garcia headed up the Bulldogs' offense scoring a team-high 13 points. Lindsay Logan followed with 12 points and Omelogo Udeze added in 11. Udeze also pulled down a game-high nine rebounds.

BERNASCONI'S BACK... Junior point guard Rosa Bernasconi made her eager return to the hardwood after being sidelined with a broken hand during the first six weeks of the season. The 1999 All-WCC honoree didn't miss a beat in her first game back against Fresno State last week. Bernasconi was true to form as she tallied 14 points and dished out a game-high seven assists. As if that was not enough the 5-6 Arizona native also led the game with four steals on the night improving her career total to 147. Bernasconi currently stands tied for sixth on the career steals chart.

UN'SELF'ISH EFFORT... It was baptism by fire for freshman guard Raelen Self who was asked to step into a starting role during the absence of teammate Rosa Bernasconi. Self, who hails from Waipahu, Hawaii, is no stranger to the leadership role; she led her high school team to the state championships her junior and senior years and was named USA Today All-American honorable mention following her sophomore campaign. So far with the Lions, Self has tallied 19 points, is 4-of-9 (.444) from beyond the arc, 3-of-3 from the free throw line and has picked up eight rebounds, nine assists and three steals.

WILHOIT NAMED WCC COACH OF THE YEAR... Head Coach Julie Wilhoit captured the WCC Coach of the Year Award after guiding the Lions to their highest finish since 1990 last year. She is the first LMU women's basketball coach to earn the top coaching nod. Wilhoit is currently in her sixth season at the helm of the LMU women's basketball program. She was named the fourth head coach in the program's history on June 30, 1995. Wilhoit came to LMU after a two-year stint at the University of Pittsburgh-Bradford. With the Lions, she holds a 45-98 (.315) overall record and 17-59 (.239) record in West Coast Conference play. Wilhoit is in her 13th year as a head coach and owns a 166-168 (.497) overall record.

THE BEAR FACTS... The Lions look to spoil Baylor's perfect 7-0 record next week. The Bears have enjoyed success on the road as well as at home recording five of their seven wins on the road. Baylor is led by Sheila Lampert who has collected 158 points on the season and leads the team with a 22.6 points per game average. Following Lampert is Danielle Crockrom with a 20.1 points per game average (141 total). Crockrom is heading up the Bears attack on the glass as she has brought in a total of 76 rebounds on the year. Baylor has been on an offensive frenzy outscoring its opponents 627-397 while also winning the rebounding battle by a 368-235 margin. Kim Mulkey-Robertson is in her first season with the Bears and first as a collegiate head coach. The all-time series record between the Lions and the Bears stands tied at 1-1, with LMU recording the most recent victory (71-55) on Dec. 21, 2000.

HUSKY HIGHLIGHTS... The University of Washington is looking to extend its three-game winning streak as it has improved its record to 4-2 on the year. The Huskies only two losses this season have come at the hands of Indiana (74-77) and Connecticut (54-100). The 54-point loss to UConn was not only the worst this season but the worst in the program's history as well. UW's largest margin of victory this season came in a 73-60 win at Michigan. Megan Franza is the Huskies' leading scorer averaging 15.2 points per game, she is also the team's leader in assists with 20. Giuliana Mendiola brings in a squad-high 7.3 rebounds per game while also contributing 11.5 points per contest. In her five season with the Huskies, head coach June Daugherty has amassed a 63-58 record, her career coaching record stands at 186-132 over 12 years. The match-up between the Lions and the Huskies marks the second meeting between the two schools. UW owns a 1-0 advantage in the series recording a 93-54 win over LMU on Dec. 20, 1997.

THE DEAL ON THE DUKES... James Madison currently owns a 4-3 record and will face West Virginia on Dec. 16 before traveling to Seattle, Wash. for the Seattle Times Classic. The Dukes are coming off a 72-65 win over the University of Massachusetts. The win marked the third victory for JMU in its last four games. Leading the Dukes' offensive effort is Shanna Price who is averaging 13.7 points per game and has collected a total of 82 points on the year. On her heels for the team scoring lead is Nadine Morgan who has tallied a total of 81 points this season. Morgan has been busy on the boards as well leading JMU with 43 through seven games. Head coach Bud Childers is in his fourth season with the Dukes and has compiled a 51-44 record at JMU. James Madison opens the Seattle Times Classic with a game against Western Michigan. Should the Lions and Dukes meet in day two of the tournament it would be the second meeting between the two programs. LMU holds a 1-0 advantage last defeating JMU (57-46) on Dec. 23, 1998.

THE BLURB ON THE BRONCOS... Western Michigan is looking for anything to jump start its team as the Broncos have gotten off to a sluggish 1-4 start of the 2000-01 season. WMU recorded its only win of the season (79-77) on Nov. 25 at Wake Forest. Since then the Broncos have suffered three straight losses and are hoping to come away from the Seattle Times Classic with a couple of wins. Western Michigan will travel to Notre Dame before heading to Seattle, Wash. and has the opportunity to add another win as they face the Fighting Irish on Dec. 18. Sarah Hurlle leads the Broncos averaging 22.4 points per game while Karen Deurloo heads up the rebounding effort bringing down 5.8 boards per game. Ron Stewart is in his fourth season at the helm of the Western Michigan women's basketball program compiling a 45-45 record with the Broncos. WMU opens the Seattle Times Classic with a game against James Madison. Should the Lions and Broncos meet in day two of the tournament it would be the third meeting between the two programs. LMU holds a 2-0 advantage last defeating WMU (63-56) on Nov. 29, 1991.
