Lions Finish Turn-around Season in Fifth

QUICKLY

The Loyola Marymount University men's basketball team finished in a tie for fifth place in the West Coast Conference with a record of 5-9 and 9-19 overall. The season was a dramatic turnaround for the Lions, as they welcomed a new era of Lions basketball under first year head coach Steve Aggers, who was named 2001 West Coast Conference Coach of the Year by *CollegeInsider.Com*, who announced their award winners in early March.

WCC HONORS

The Lions' season earned senior **Elton Mashack** and junior **Marcus Smith** all-conference accolades, with Mashack taking home first team honors. The senior is bringing to conclusion one of the all-time top four-year performances in school history, as he became only the 11th player in school history to score 1,000 career points and grab 500 career rebounds. He finished second on the team with 11.6 points per game, which was 12th in the conference. Smith, who was a finalist for defensive player of the year in the WCC, finished leading the team with 30 steals and 10th in the WCC with 2.59 assists per game. Smith also earned Academic All-Conference honors, making him the first player in school history to earn both Academic and All-WCC accolades (The conference began naming All-Academic teams in the 1990-91 season). Joining Smith on the All-Academic list is senior **Pablo Machado**, who earns the honor for the second consecutive season.

SEASON OF FIRSTS

With an overall record of 9-19 and 5-9 mark in the WCC, the Lions improved their record by seven wins, five in the conference and ended up dropping six games by five points or less. With the turn around, the Lions accomplished many firsts in over a year. The Lions won their first road contest in 23 games with a 78-59 win against Sacramento State on Dec. 9. That week Lakey scored a season and career-high 29 points as he became the Lions first WCC Player of the Week selection in two years. The Lions would go back on the road on Dec. 21 and earn the Lions first back-to-back road wins since Jan. of 1997. The sweep against Portland this season was the Lions' first since sweeping conference rival Pepperdine in 1996. They added a second sweep with two wins over Saint Mary's, making it the first time since 1991 the Lions have swept two teams in the same season.

GAME #28-WCC TOURNAMENT FIRST ROUND - SANTA CLARA

For the seventh time in tournament play, the Lions took on Santa Clara in the first round. For only the second time, LMU was on the losing end, as Santa Clara took home the 77-60 win on March 3. The sixth-seeded Lions (9-19), whose seven game improvement from the 1999-00 season is the fifth best ever in program history, fell down early and could never recover to the third-seeded Broncos (19-11). The Broncos finished the first half-shooting 15-for-30 from the field (50 percent), including 4-for-10 from the three-point line. The Broncos only trailed once in the game, 4-2 with 17:45 in the half. Once the Broncos regained the lead it never fell below seven. Robert Davis, the team's leading scorer with more than 12 points per game, finished with 14. All-WCC honorable mention selection Marcus Smith finished with 12 points.

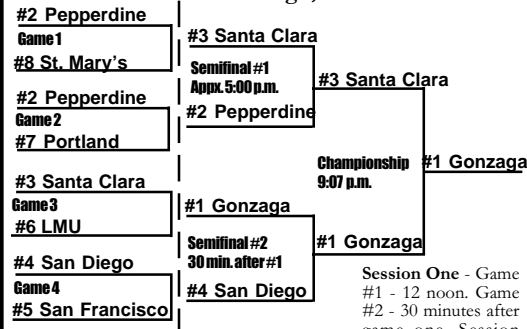

Head Coach Steve Aggers



Steve Aggers concludes his first season as head coach of the Loyola Marymount men's basketball program, the 22nd head coach in the history of the institution. Aggers came from Eastern Washington University where he had a phenomenal five-year run, guiding the Eagles to its first Big Sky Conference title in school history. Aggers was named Big Sky Coach of the Year and the National Association of Basketball Coaches' District 13 Coach of the Year.

The winner of more Big Sky Conference games than any other coach in Eastern Washington University history, Aggers led the Eagles to 32 conference wins in the past four seasons. Since joining the Big Sky in 1984, EWU had won only 34 conference games combined. Aggers took the Eagle basketball program to new levels, as the team rose from a power ranking of No. 298 to No. 106 in 1999-2000.

"I am extremely thankful for the opportunity I've been given and I see this as a new beginning and a fresh start," said Aggers, who was hired in April of 2000. "My staff and I are looking forward toward a very bright and dynamic future. One of the reasons I accepted this job was the location of the institution, its proud past with a rich athletic tradition, strong academic reputation and the outstanding recruiting base it provides. Our goals and objectives are not to just be competitive, but to build a championship program."

Aggers entered the 2000-2001 season with a mark of 315-269, and he currently sits at 324-288 wrapping up his first season at LMU (9-19). He returns to the West Coast Conference where he served as an assistant with Pepperdine for four years (1990-1994). He has been coaching on the collegiate level for 26 years.

TURNABOUT

The Lions' turn around by first year head coach Steve Aggers is one of the best in school history, as they improved by seven wins and increased their winning percentage by .250. LMU's 16-game change between the 1986-87 and the 1987-88 seasons is the best ever in school history. The Lions went from 12-16 to 28-4 in one season under Paul Westhead. The 28 win season is the best ever at LMU. This season, the Lions' turn around was the fifth best ever and second best under a first-year head coach. Aggers is second only to Westhead, who in his first season took the Lions from a 11-16 record in 1984-85 to a 19-11 mark in 1985-86 and a bid in the NIT.

BALANCED DIET

The Lions threw a balanced diet of scoring at opponents this season, getting offense throughout the lineup. The Lions had 18 games on the 2000-01 season in which three or more players scored in double digits, including their latest win against Saint Mary's. Three players finished averaging double figures in scoring on the season, **Robert Davis** 11.9 ppg, senior **Elton Mashack** with 11.3 ppg and junior **Greg Lakey** with 10.4 ppg. LMU has had 10 different players score in double figures and seven different players have led the game in scoring (see the breakdown on page 19). Freshman forward **Sherman Gay** was the latest to score in double-digits with 11 against Gonzaga. Junior **Marcus Smith** was the seventh player to lead the team in scoring with 18 against Saint Mary's hitting seven-of-eight from the field. He added another 18 against Portland, his second game of the season leading the Lions in scoring. He added his third against Santa Clara with 11 and fourth to close out the regular season with 19 against Saint Mary's. In the conference, Davis finished 11th, while Mashack was ranked 13th and Lakey at 15th.

ROAD WARRIORS

The Lions become road warriors this season, earning some important wins outside of Gersten Pavilion. LMU finishes the season 4-11 on the road, winning two road conference games for the first time since the 1997-98 season. LMU broke a 23-game road losing streak with a 19-point win over Sacramento State on Dec. 9 and earned their second straight road victory with a 63-53 win over Loyola-Chicago. It was the first time the Lions have won two consecutive road games since 1997 when the Lions

defeated Pepperdine in overtime on Jan. 24 and following three at home went on the road to defeat St. Mary's on Feb. 5. They earned their first conference road win in 11 games with the 71-63 win in Moraga over Saint Mary's. Their last WCC road win had been against San Diego on Jan. 21, 1999.

LIGHTS OUT

Against Vanguard the Lions didn't get off to a bad start to the 2000-01 season, finishing the game hitting 59 percent of their shots. It was the first game since hitting 37-of-58 (.638) in a 101-87 win over St. Mary's on Jan. 29, 1999, the Lions finished a regular season game hitting more than 50 percent of their field goals. In the 87-64 win over Vanguard, the Lions hit 70 percent in the first half, including 4-of-7 from the three-point line. The Gaels were once again a victim of hot shooting, as the Lions finished the game hitting 51 percent (25-49) of their shots, including a 59 percent (16-27) effort in the first half and 62 percent (5-8) from the three-point line in a 71-63 win on Jan. 22. On the season, the Lions finished the season with five games shooting better than 50 percent of their shots, hitting 55 percent against Colorado and 51 percent against Sacramento State. They concluded their road schedule with a 59 percent (29-49) effort against Portland. Against the Hornets, the Lions finished hitting 29-of-56 from the field. It looked to be more of the same against USF, as the Lions finished the first half hitting 56 percent (14-25) from the field. They finished the game at 44 percent (25-57). The loss to Colorado was the first time the Lions have dropped a game hitting more than half their shots since Boise State on Nov. 21, 1998, when the Lions hit 25-of-44 in a 93-86 loss in Gersten Pavilion.

LEAVING THEM IN THE COLD

Defense was a key for the Lions, as they have made opposing offenses feel left in the cold from the field. When the Lions' defense held the opponents offense to worse shooting than their offense, they finished the season 8-3. On the road, the Lions defense has been especially tough. The Lions held UNLV to 37 percent from the field (27-73), the fourth opponent the Lions have held to under 40 percent. The win against Loyola-Chicago was the best yet for the LMU "D". How cold was it for the Ramblers? The Lions kept them without a three-point field goal, 0-10, despite entering the game hitting more than 35 percent on the season. In the Lions' first two road wins, their opponents were a combined 1-28 from the three-point line. The defense followed them home, as the Lions opened West Coast Conference play with a 62-59 win against San Diego, holding the Toreros to 40 percent shooting from the field and a mere 15 percent from the three-point line (2-of-13). On the season, the Lions' defense has held their opponents to 33.9 percent (167-493) from the three-point line, which finished ranked third in the league.

SENIOR LEADER

Senior **Elton Mashack** concluded an All-WCC first-team season in his final campaign as a Lion. He earned his 100th career appearance against Portland on Feb. 2 while scoring a double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds. He finished 13th in the conference with 11.3 points per game and seventh with 6.1 rebounds per game. He scored a season high 19 at home against Santa Clara, after breaking his season high in each of the previous five games. He had 15 points and 11 rebounds to lead the Lions in both categories for the fifth time this season against Pepperdine. He added 15 more in the win against Portland on Feb. 17 to put the Lions LMU Men's Basketball Release -- page 4

in position for a fifth place tie in the WCC. He finished the season leading the Lions in scoring seven times and rebounding 12 times. With his All-Conference season, Mashack finished his career at LMU as one of the school's best. With 811 points and 375 rebounds in his previous three years at Loyola Marymount, Mashack had the opportunity to join an elite list of only 10 players that have accomplished the feat of scoring 1,000 points and grabbing 500 rebounds in a career. With 19 points against Santa Clara, hitting two free throws with 28 seconds left, Mashack became the 26th player in LMU history to score 1,000 points in a career. He completed the other half of the equation with three rebounds against Portland, giving him 500 in his career. He finishes the 2001 season with 304 points and 166 rebounds, giving him **1,115 points and 541 rebounds** in his career at LMU. He concludes his career as the 19th all-time leading scorer, surpassing Steve Smith with 1,109. In addition, he ranks 17th in the record books with his 541 rebounds, replacing Dick Sebek with 539.

ON THE BOARDS

Despite the smaller line-up of the Lions, who had only two players over 6-8, they finished with a +1.2 edge on the boards. The Lions, who are ranked fifth in rebound margin in the WCC, out rebounded their opponents in 18 of 28 games this season. The first two games saw the Lions dominate the glass, out rebounding a much taller UC Irvine squad, who features two 7-footers, 38-35 and Vanguard 37-24. The Lions also out rebounded UNLV and San Diego State 54-50 and 35-32. In one stretch this season, the Lions held a 42-24 advantage at Idaho State, 40-33 advantage against Portland State and 41-29 against Long Beach State. Individually, **Elton Mashack** is seventh in the conference with 6.1 per

game. In the 1999-00 season, the Lions had only seven games in which they out rebounded an opponent.

WELCOME BACK

Loyola Marymount welcomed back the services of junior **Robert Davis**. The 6-2 guard from Tempe, Ariz., began his collegiate career at LMU in 1998-99 where he averaged 7.1 points and 2.3 rebounds a game as a true freshman. Last year Davis transferred to Chandler Gilbert Junior College where he led the conference with 26.2 points per game. He wraps up a successful junior campaign with a team-leading 11.9 points per game and has led the Lions in scoring in 10 of the 28 games this season, the most on the team. Davis enjoys playing the Pac-10 neighbors of Southern California, as he earned a career high 21 against USC, with his previous high of 17 against UCLA in his freshman season on Dec. 29, 1998. Davis also averaged 4.2 rebounds per game, fourth on the team. He finished with 66 assists and 21 steals on the season. More leading stats - he led the team with 46 three-pointers in 136 attempts (.338). In the conference, he is ranked 11th in scoring (11.9) and sixth in three-pointers made per game (1.64).

MAKE THAT A DOUBLE

After seeing his first action in over a year since transferring to LMU from USC, junior **Greg Lakey** earned his first career double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds in the Lions 87-64 win over Vanguard. That was a sign of things to come, as the forward just keeps setting career records in this 2000-01 campaign. Lakey averaged 10.4 points and 4.6 rebounds per game. He led the team in scoring with 16 in game one against Pepperdine and earned a career high 29 against Sacramento State. Against Saint Mary's, he had his 14th game this season in double figures with 13. He is third on the team in scoring and third in rebounds. In the West Coast Conference, he ranked 15th in scoring. He suffered a heal injury against Portland and was forced to sit three games, but responded in the second meeting against the Pilots with 15 points. Lakey averaged 5.1 points per game in two seasons with Southern California, earning 19 starts his freshman season in 1997-98.

IN THE MIDDLE

Senior center **Pablo Machado** concludes his fourth and final season of collegiate basketball. Prior to transferring from Georgia Tech two years ago to LMU, Machado earned his sixth career double-double with 11 points and 12 rebounds against Sacramento State. He had a solid start to the season with 19 points and seven rebounds against Vanguard. The Venezuela native is fourth on the team with 8.8 points per game and is second on the team with 5.5 rebounds per game, including eight against San Francisco in the final home stand. His 2.52 offensive rebounds per game is fourth in the league.

TEAM IS FIRST

Junior **Eurskine Robinson**, who transferred from College of the Canyons, led the team with 85 assists on the season, which is good for fifth in the WCC (3.04 apg). Robinson broke College of the Canyons' career assist record with 421. As a team, the Lions dished out 14.14 assists per game, third in the WCC. Junior **Marcus Smith** finished tied for 10th in the conference with 70 assists on the season (2.52 per game). With his assists, Robinson is fourth in the league with an assist/turnover ratio of 1.37. Putting the team play in perspective, the Lions have 396 assists on the season while hitting 655 field goals. That translates to more than 60 percent of the Lions' baskets earn an assist. With 22 assists on 32 shots, the Lions assisted on 69 percent of its baskets against Portland on Feb. 2. The best this season came against Sacramento State, the Lions assisted on a season high 80 percent of their baskets with 23 assists on 29 field goals. Against Saint Mary's, the Lions assisted on 18 of 25 field goals (72 percent) in the win. In Chicago, LMU dished out 14 assists on 18 field goals, 77 percent of its baskets. In the loss to UCSB, the Lions still managed to dish out 17 assists on 23 field goals, good for 74 percent. A year ago, LMU averaged a league low 11.3 assists a game. LMU finished the game against Vanguard with 21 assists, the highest assist total for the

Lions since they had 25 against St. Mary's on Jan. 29, 1999 in a 101-87 win.

STEPPING IT UP IN THE WCC

Juniors **Marcus Smith** and **Sean Mollins** have found a new home in the West Coast Conference. In WCC action, Smith and Mollins have risen to the top of the Lions' scoring leaders. They are averaging 10.0 and 6.8 points per game respectively, which contrasts to their 5.6 and 2.7 points per game in non-conference play. Smith scored a career high 18 against Saint Mary's and then followed up with another 18 against Portland. He finished the game against Saint Mary's shooting 7-of-8 from the field. In the finale against the Gaels at Gersten Pavilion, Smith set a career high with 19. He has led the team in scoring in four of the conference games. His WCC efforts earned his all-conference honorable mention honors in his inaugural campaign. Mollins, a walk-on from De Anza Junior College had a career high 11 points in game one against Pepperdine, added nine points in the win against San Diego and eight against Santa Clara. He earned his first start against San Diego. Against the Toreros in the first game of conference play, Mollins knocked down the biggest shot of his career, hitting the game-winner with 14 seconds left. In both games, Mollins showed his range hitting a three-pointer to add to his career totals. He has also been a force on the glass for the Lions, grabbing a game-high eight against Saint Mary's. He turned around the next night to play a career-high 31 minutes while scoring seven points and gathering six rebounds against USF. For the Lions in conference play, Smith and Mollins rank third and sixth on the team in points per game.

Game Capsules

GAME #1 - LMU 87, Vanguard 54

The Loyola Marymount University men's basketball team earned a 87-64 win over Vanguard University (0-2) in their season opener of the 2000-2001 campaign. In the process they ended a 15-game losing streak dating back to Jan. 8 and earned a win in Head Coach Steve Aggers first regular season with the Lions. The Lions finished the game shooting 59 percent from the field, with five players scoring in double figures and nine players receiving more than 10 minutes playing time. The Lions built a 14-point halftime lead on 70 percent shooting and an 11-point, eight-rebound performance by junior **Greg Lakey**. The junior finished with his first double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds, struggling with foul trouble in the second half and fouling out with 5:41 left in the game. Senior **Pablo Machado** finished with a team high 19 points and seven rebounds, many coming with four fouls late in the game. Also scoring in double figures was senior **Elton Mashack** with 15, junior **Philipp Czernin** with 13 and junior **Robert Davis** with 11. Vanguard's smaller line-up caused trouble for the LMU's perimeter defense, as guard Dennis Keane scored 33 points on 14-of-22 shooting, including a 3-of-6 effort from the three-point line.

GAME #2 - UC Irvine 62, LMU 57

The Lions began their four-game road trip hoping to snap a 19-game road losing streak against the Big West's UC Irvine. The Lions, despite a comeback effort, fell to the Anteaters, 62-57 at the Bren Event Center. The Lions fell behind by 10, 31-21, at the half after going 8-for-29 from the field (27 percent). Including the two exhibition wins, it was the worst shooting percentage in the Lions' first three games. LMU managed to cut the lead to two halfway through the second thanks to a pair of **Pablo Machado** free throws and three-pointers from **Eurskine Robinson** and **Philipp Czernin**. The 'Eaters used a flawless offense the last half of the game to hold on to the win. Robinson led the Lions with 11 points, five rebounds, five assists and a steal. Junior **Robert Davis** also finished in double figures with 10 points. For the second straight game the Lions held the edge in rebounding, 38-35 despite facing two seven footers for UC Irvine. Senior **Elton Mashack** had nine boards and junior **Greg Lakey**

had eight.

GAME #3 - USC 91, LMU 68

The Lions' adventures on the road have not been of the friendly kind, and heading into 20th ranked USC, it didn't get much better. Loyola Marymount men's basketball fell to Southern California at the Los Angeles Sports Arena 91-68. The Lions (1-2) fell behind early, trailing 47-34 and could not recover from the Trojans' 50 percent shooting from the three-point line. USC finished the game hitting 12-of-24 from long range, including a seven-of-11 clip (63 percent) in the second half. Both junior **Greg Lakey** and senior **Pablo Machado** fouled out of the game for the Lions, who finished with 22 fouls on the game compared to USC's 12. The Trojans finished the game hitting 21-of-27 from the charity stripe and the Lions finished nine-of-14. Junior **Robert Davis**, who played at LMU as a freshman and transferred to Chandler Gilbert Junior College last year before returning to the Lions, finished the game with 21 points, breaking a career high of 17 he scored against UCLA on Dec. 29, 1998. Davis finished the game hitting nine-of-15 from the field, including two-of-five from the three-point line. USC's Brian Scalabrine finished the game with a game-high 22 points on six-of-11 shooting, including an eight-of-10 effort from the free throw line. Senior **Elton Mashack** finished with 15 points and eight rebounds and junior **Eurskine Robinson** finished with 11 points and three rebounds.

GAME #4 - Colorado 94, LMU 79

The Loyola Marymount University men's basketball team knew they could steal one on the road if they stayed with their game plan and controlled the tempo of the game. They did, but for only 30 of the 40 minute game. The 10 minutes proved disastrous, as the Lions dropped a heart-breaking 94-79 loss to the Buffaloes on Tuesday night in Boulder, Colo. The Lions jumped out to an 11-point lead in the first half and controlled the tempo in leading for all but the final seconds of the first stanza. The Lions saw the Buffs D.J. Harrison hit a 10-footer with no time left to give the Buffs the one point lead, 33-32. The Buffs never looked back, scoring 21 straight in a five-minute span in the second half to put the game out of reach. Offensively, the Lions were led by junior **Robert Davis**' hot shooting in the first, as he hit 4-of-5 from the three-point line and finished hitting 5-of-6 for 14 points to lead the Lions into halftime. Senior **Elton Mashack** added seven as the Lions hit 12-of-18 from the field (67 percent). In contrast, they held the Buffs to 44 percent (13-of-29) from the field. The Buffs would finish the game hitting 51 percent, thanks to the hot shooting of **Nick Mohr**, who came off the bench to score all of his 20 points in the second. He finished 5-of-8 from the three-point line and 6-of-12 from the field for the game. Mohr hit 14 straight points for the Buffs in CU's run in the second. Despite the Lions hot first half shooting, they only hit 3-of-9 from the free throw line and were out rebound 20-11 in the first. The second half was improved, as they made the Buffs pay with aggressive play, hitting 20-of-26 from the charity stripe, finishing 24-35 (66 percent) for the game. Junior **Greg Lakey**'s 9-of-10 effort led the Lions from the line. Lakey led the Lions with 20 points, 16 in the second half. It was a career high for the transfer from USC. Senior **Pablo Machado** finished with 16 points and five rebounds and Mashack finished with 12 points and six rebounds.

GAME #5 - Idaho State 71, LMU 68

As the Loyola Marymount men's basketball team wrapped up a four-game road trip, one thing has been solidified--they are going to have to fight for a win on the road. The Lions fell 71-68 to Idaho State in Pocatello, Idaho, on Saturday night, having every opportunity to pull out the win. The Lions had their shots, holding a one-point lead at half, building a 12-point lead halfway through the second half, out rebounding the Bengals 42-24, and holding a two-point lead with 2:47 remaining. It still wasn't enough, as the Lions, who shot 57 percent (16-28) in the first half, went ice cold in the second, shooting only 33 percent (12-36), including five straight misses in the final possession in an attempt to tie the game at 71. They finished the game hitting 43 percent (28-64). It was a back-and-forth ball game with nine lead changes and four ties. The Lions, holding a size advantage down in the blocks, fouled out the Bengals only two big men in Rashad Kirkland and J.T. Nelson. With ISU's smaller line-up, the Lions scored 42 points in the paint and had 22 second chance points thanks to 19 offensive rebounds. Senior **Pablo Machado** led the Lions on the boards with eight total rebounds, six on the offensive glass. He finished with 14 points. Coming off the bench in the post was **Greg Lakey**, who had six rebounds and 15 points, hitting six-of-12 from the field. The Lions also got 15 points and seven rebounds from junior **Robert Davis**. However, it was the hot shooting of Jordie McTavish for the Bengals that put ISU ahead. The senior for Idaho State had 26 points, including 16 in the second half. Known for his three-point shooting, McTavish was three-of-13 for the game. It was his foul shooting that

did the Lions in, as he finished nine-of-10 from the line. Point guard **Eurskine Robinson**, who fouled out 30 seconds was kept out with four fouls for the majority of the second half. Idaho State finished the game 21-of-26 from the line, while the Lions hit 10-of-15. GAME #6 - LMU 65, CS Fullerton 56

After holding double digit leads in their last two games on the road, only to see them disappear with late rallies, the Loyola Marymount (2-4) men's basketball team returned home to Gersten Pavilion on a mission to put a team away. The Lions did just that, defeating Cal State Fullerton (1-4) 65-56 on Tuesday night, and in the process removing "monkeys" off their backs. The Lions jumped out early on the Titans, building leads up to nine points throughout and never trailing in the contest in breaking a 32-game losing streak to Division I opponents. LMU, who just returned from a four-game road trip, are now 7-1 after returning home from road trips of three or more games. The Lions, who are becoming known for their balanced attack, once again had three players score in double figures. It is the third straight game the Lions have accomplished that feat, and the first time since the 1998-99 season. Junior **Philipp Czernin** had his best outing of the season in scoring a game high 17 points. Also in double figures were senior **Pablo Machado** with 12 and junior **Robert Davis** with 10. Cal State Fullerton had four players in double figures, led by Ike Harmon and Kevin Richardson, each with 12. Harmon entered the game as the Titan's leading scorer with 15 points per game, including a season high 28 in the Titan's win in their previous game against the College of Notre Dame. However, the Lions clamped down on the fifth-year senior and kept off balance in the first half, hitting only two free throws in seven minutes of play. He finished 6-of-13 from the field. The Titans were 20-of-47 from the field and the Lions finished with 14 turnovers. A game after out rebounding Idaho State by 18, the Lions once again won the battle on the boards, 32-30, including another solid performance on the offense glass with 12. However, it was the fouls that once again came into play for the Lions. It was the second game in a row the Lions forced the opponent's big man to foul out, as senior Matt Caldwell finished the game with seven points and five fouls. LMU finished hitting 26-of-37 from the free throw line, while Cal State Fullerton finished 13-of-18.

GAME #7 - LMU 78, Sacramento State 59

The Lions, four days removed from breaking a 32-game streak against NCAA Division I opponents, put an end to another streak and started another one of their own. The Lions ended their 23-game road losing streak with a 78-59 win over Sacramento State at Arco Arena. With the win, the Lions earned back-to-back wins for the first time since posting three straight in January 1999. The third win in that streak came on Jan. 21, 1999, a 89-73 victory over the Toreros. It was the last win on the road for the Lions and the last double-digit win on the road. Leading the front line players was junior **Greg Lakey**, who continues to shine for the Lions off the bench. He finished with a game high and a career high 29 points and added 7 rebounds. However, it was the defense that shut the Hornets down. The Lions held Sacramento State to 24-of-62 from the field (38 percent) and a mere 1-of-19 from the three-point line (5 percent). The Lions finished shooting 51 percent from the field (29-of-56). The Lions jumped out to a 12-point lead in the first half thanks in part to points in transition and in the paint. The Lions first 10 points were under the basket, as LMU's big men pushed the Lions' field goal percentage at the half to 58 percent (18-31). Lakey, who leads the team shooting 53 percent on the season, hit 5-of-6 on the half for 12 points. He finished the game hitting 10-of-12 from the field (83 percent) and a perfect 9-of-9 from the free throw line. In building a lead as big as 14 points, the Lions went into halftime leading for the third straight game. While LMU was shooting well, the defense clamped down to hold the Hornets to only 41 percent from the field and 11 percent (1-of-9) from the three-point line. The Lions came out in the second and extended their lead to 17 and then as high as 19 in putting away the Hornets. In the process the Lions outrebounded the Hornets 39-35, the fifth game of the season the Lions out rebounded their opponents. Leading under the boards was senior **Pablo Machado**, who had sixth career double-double with 12 rebounds and 11 points. Fellow senior **Elton Mashack** added 10 points, while junior **Philipp Czernin** just missed a triple-double with nine points, nine assists and eight rebounds.

GAME #8 - Portland State 66, LMU 62

Anthony Lackey scored a game-high 17 points and the Viking's Jabbar Washington added 12 points, including 2 free throws with one second remaining, as Portland State ended Loyola Marymount's two-game winning streak with a 66-62 non-conference victory Saturday night at Gersten Pavilion.

The Lions (3-5) used an 11-3 run, the last six of which were scored by Pablo Machado, to take a 49-46 lead with 10:31 remaining. However, the Lions made just one field goal in a 7:50 stretch, and permitted a 10-0 Vikings run to fall behind 60-54 with 2:07 remaining. **Robert Davis's** 3-point basket trimmed the deficit to 62-59 with 49 seconds remaining, but **Eurskine Robinson** missed the front end of a one-and-one with 17 seconds left and Charles Madison made two free throws with 13 seconds left to give the Vikings a 64-59 lead. Davis's 25-foot 3-point basket with one second remaining cut the deficit to 64-62. The Lions fouled Washington prior to the inbounds pass, and Washington sank both free throws to clinch the victory for the Vikings. Portland State (2-6) was 9-for-9 from the free throw line in the final three minutes, and made 11-of-12 free throws in the game. The Lions made just 10-of-19 free throws, and committed 20 turnovers while forcing just 13. LMU outrebounded the Vikings 40-33, and limited Portland State to 38.7 percent shooting from the field. Davis and **Pablo Machado** led the Lions with 14 points each, and **Greg Lakey** added 13 points and a game-high 8 rebounds. Machado made 7 of 9 shots, and Lakey improved his 60 percent field goal shooting with a 5-for-6 effort. Davis equaled his career high with 4 three-point baskets.

GAME #9 - Long Beach State 57, LMU 54

The heartbreakers continue for the Loyola Marymount men's basketball team, as the Lions fell to Long Beach State 57-54 in a non-conference game Monday night at Gersten Pavilion. The Lions fell down early, thanks to the 49ers' Ramel Lloyd, who finished with 20 points, and Travis Reed, who added 13. The Lions committed 18 first half turnovers that led to the early deficit. They finished the game with 24 turnovers, but held the 49ers to 57 points, 21 below their season average. The 49ers (6-4) led 28-12 with 2:13 left in the first half before the Lions (3-6) went on a 25-4 run, capped by **Philipp Czernin's** dunk, to take a 37-32 lead with 10:52 remaining in the game. Lloyd responded by scoring 13 of the 49ers' next 16 points, capped by a 3-point basket from the left wing, to tie the game 48-48 with 6:08 left. Junior **Robert Davis's** 3-point basket from the left corner gave the Lions a 54-51 lead with 2:20 remaining, but Reed made two consecutive lay-ups, the latter with 20 seconds left, to give the 49ers a 55-54 lead. LMU's **Marcus Smith** missed a 10-foot jumper with three seconds left and the rebound went out-of-bounds to Long Beach State. Ron Johnson made a layup at the buzzer for the final points. Davis scored 18 points for the Lions, all in the second half including a career-high five 3-point baskets, and reserve center **Greg Lakey** added 10 points and three steals. The Lions outrebounded the 49ers 41-29, but shot just 34.6 percent from the field (18-of-52). The 49ers shot just 41.5 percent from the field (22-53), but made eight of their last 10 field-goal attempts. The game featured seven lead changes, including five in the final 5:23, and five ties.

GAME #10 - LMU 63, Loyola-Chicago 53

It was 30 degrees below zero outside of the Joseph Gentile Center at the campus of Loyola University-Chicago, and it carried over inside as the Loyola Marymount men's basketball team held the Ramblers to 30 percent shooting to earn a 63-53 in Chicago on Thursday night. The Lions, who improve to 4-6 on the season, won their second consecutive on the road, the first time since winning back-to-back road games in December of 1995. The Lions relied on defense in this one, as they completely shutdown the perimeter shooting of Loyola (2-8). Loyola, who entered the game shooting 44 percent from the field and 35 percent from the three-point line, was held to a 22-of-72 effort from the field and 0-10 from long range. Loyola's David Bailey, a sophomore, entered the game averaging 18 points per game. The combination of junior Marcus Smith, who earned his first start of the season, and **Eurskine Robinson** held Bailey to 11 points. The Lions jumped out to a 13 point lead in the first half thanks to 10 first half points by senior **Elton Mashack**, who finished the game with 15. Falling behind quickly 4-0, the Lions responded with an 11-point run and a 23-9 lead with 8:34 left. However, Loyola went on an 8-point run late as the Lions held onto a 31-30 lead at halftime. Loyola had 14 first half offensive rebounds and finished the game out rebounding the Lions 51-42. It was only the third time in LMU's 10 games this season they have been out rebounded. Loyola came out and took a quick four-point lead before the Lions' started working the ball inside and creating opportunities for junior **Greg Lakey**, who started in place of Machado. It paid off, as Lakey finished the game with a team-high 20 points, including a 10-of-16 effort from the free throw line. The Lions retook the lead on two free throw's by Lakey with 10:33 to play and never trailed again. On the game, the Lions finished 25-of-35 (71 percent) from the free throw stripe, including six straight with less than a minute to play in the game--two by junior **Robert Davis** and four by Smith. All of the Lions' forced Loyola into 25 fouls compared to their 18.

GAME #11 - UC Santa Barbara 85, LMU 69

their winning ways on the road, as the Lions scored only one field goal in final 4:30 in falling to UC Santa Barbara 85-69. The Lions jumped out to an early lead, but were outscored by 17 in the second half as they fal to 4-7 on the season. The loss snapped the Lions two -game road winning streak. For the first time since the Lions third game of the season the Lions allowed an opponent to shot 50 percent. The Gauchos finished the game shooting 52 percent (32-61). The Lions had held its last two opponents to under 35 percent shooting. The game was closer than the final score, as the game had eight ties and right lead changes. However, it was UCSB's hot shooting down the stretch that sealed the win for the Gauchos. They were led by freshman Nick Jones, who had a season high 19 points. The Gauchos had four players in double figures. The Lions also had four players in double figures, led by **Robert Davis's** 17 points. He was two-of-four from long range, as the Lions took the 38-37 first half lead thanks to 5-of-7 shooting from the three-point line. The Lions finished the game hitting 7-of-12 from three-point line (58 percent) and 23-of-51 from the field (45 percent). The Lions turned the ball over 23 times, compared to only 10 by the Gauchos. Also scoring in double figures for the Lions was **Elton Mashack** with 16, **Eurskine Robinson** with 12 and **Greg Lakey** with 10.

GAME #12 - UNLV 75, LMU 60

The depth of the University of Nevada-Las Vegas eventually wore down the depleted Loyola Marymount University Lions, as UNLV defeated the Lions 75-60 at the Thomas and Mack Center in Las Vegas on Wednesday night. "We played very hard tonight in a hostile environment," said head coach Steve Aggers. "We played together and showed signs of improving as a team." Playing with only seven scholarship players and three walk-ons, thanks in part to the injury to starting center **Pablo Machado** who sat out his third straight game with a hip flexor injury, the Lions battled to the end, making it much closer than the 75-60 final indicated. The Lions trailed by only six at half and cut the deficit to four with 11:06 left in the game thanks in part to the stingy defense the Lions have begun to play on the road. They held the Rebels to 37 percent from the field (17-of-73). It was the fourth time in the last seven games the Lions held an opponent to 30 percent shooting. The Rebels got hot from the three-point line with threes from Lafonte Johnson, Lou Kelly, Jermaine Lewis and Trevor Diggs to pull away from the Lions late in the game. They finished the game hitting nine three pointers as a team on 26 attempts (35 percent). The Lions struggled from the three-point line, hitting only 2-of-19 from long range. The balanced attack by the Lions, who had 10 from junior **Greg Lakey**, seven from junior **Robert Davis** and six from **Elton Mashack** at the half, showed signs of an upset, out working the Rebels on their home floor. The Lions outscored the Rebels 44-24 in the paint, had a 24-20 edge on second chance points and a 10-4 edge on fast break points. The Rebels' Delron Johnson hurt the Lions early, scoring 15 of his game high 21 in the first half. His inside play put the Lions into early foul trouble, making the loss of Machado even tougher as Mashack and **Sean Mollins** picked up three first half fouls and Lakey earned two. Leading the Lions was Mashack, who finished with 17 points. The Lions also got 14 from Davis and 13 from Lakey. It is the ninth game of the season the Lions have had three or more players in double figures scoring.

GAME #13 - San Diego State 61, LMU 58

It was another heartbreaker for the Loyola Marymount University men's basketball program, as they dropped their fifth game of the season by five points or less. This one coming to San Diego State University, who is off to its best start in program history at 10-3, by a score of 61-58. The Lions, who drop to 4-9 on the season heading into West Coast Conference play, are experiencing what the resurgent Aztecs went through a year ago. The Lions have held leads in every game this season except the loss to USC. LMU held the lead for the majority of the first and second half. However, the lead changed hands seven ties with six ties as the Aztecs held on in the final minutes. The run was led by the Aztecs' Randy Holcomb, who scored 13 of his game-high 19 points in the second half. San Diego State has now won six consecutive games, their longest winning streak in 17 years. Karl Kovacic's three-point basket with 1:39 remaining gave the Aztecs a 59-56 lead. After **Elton Mashack** made one of two free throws, Al Faux's lay up increased the San Diego State lead to 61-57 with 1:03 left. **Eurskine Robinson** made one of two free throws for the Lions with 43 seconds left, and Faux missed the front-end of a one-and-one with 23 seconds remaining. The Lions had two opportunities to tie the game in the final seconds, but Robert Davis had two 3-point attempts glance off the rim, the latter from the left wing as time expired. LMU had a 33-28 halftime lead and led 44-36 with 11:24 remaining before the Aztecs responded with a 9-0 run to take a 45-44 lead on Holcomb's jumper with 8:32 left. It was San Diego State's first lead since its 7-5 advantage early in the game. Elton Mashack had a game high 18 points and five rebounds for the Lions. **Marcus Smith** added a career-high 11 points and **Robert Davis** added nine points and equaled

a career-high with eight rebounds. The Lions outrebounded the Aztecs 35-32, but shot just 38.5 percent from the field, including just 9-of-29 (31 percent) in the second half. The Aztecs shot 42 percent from the field (23-of-54).

GAME #14 - LMU 62, San Diego 59

Not this time. After losing five games by five or less points on the 2000-01 season, the Loyola Marymount University men's basketball team refused to let their first West Coast Conference game of the season to end the same way. **Sean Mollins'** 16-foot jumper with 17 seconds left gave LMU the lead and **Eurskine Robinson's** two free throws with five seconds clinched the Lions' come-from-behind 62-59 victory over San Diego in a West Coast Conference opener Friday night in Los Angeles. San Diego's Sam Adamo's 3-point attempt from the right wing bounced off the rim as the buzzer sounded. "We sent a message tonight to the rest of the league that this is a new era in Lions' basketball," said head coach **Steve Aggers**. "This is a different team. I am proud of our players tonight. We found a way to win." The victory was sweet for the Lions (5-9, 1-0), who lost to San Diego by 44 points (82-38) in Gersten Pavilion last year. The Lions snapped a 15-game conference losing streak. The Toreros (8-6, 0-1) have lost five of their last six games. "This was a great win for us," said Aggers. San Diego led 59-58 when Dana White missed a 3-point attempt. Mollins hit a straightaway jumper to give the Lions the lead and then stripped White of the ball as he drove the lane. Robinson picked up the loose ball and was fouled. San Diego called four time-outs in the final seconds, setting up Adamo's open 3-point attempt, which sailed just long. The Lions led 27-21 at halftime, but USD took a 45-44 lead on Adamo's jumper with 7:46 remaining. USD led by as many as five points, 53-48 with 4:36 left. Robinson hit a pair of free throws to tie the score at 54, and again at 56, before Adamo drilled a 3-pointer with 1:34 left to give the Toreros a 59-56 lead. **Elton Mashack's** layup with 1:18 left cut the deficit to 59-58 and set up Mollins' heroics. Overall, their nine lead changes and five ties in the ball game. LMU's Mashack scored 14 of his game-high 18 points in the second half. Robinson made 8-of-10 free throws, including 6-of-6 in the final 3:10 to finish with 11 points. **Robert Davis** had 13 points. Tyler Field led San Diego with 13 points and Tom Lippold added 10 points and 8 rebounds off the bench. The Lions held the Toreros to 40 percent shooting (18 of 45). The Lions made 5 of 11 three-point attempts, compared to just 2-of-13 for the Toreros. Both clubs shot well from the free throw line, with LMU making 76 percent (19 of 25) and USD 72.4 percent (21 of 29).

GAME #15 - Santa Clara 78, LMU 70

As quick as the Loyola Marymount men's basketball team took a victory in their first game of West Coast Conference play, they were quickly reminded of the ways of conference play, falling 78-70 to Santa Clara at Gersten Pavilion on Saturday night. Playing in back-to-back games for the first time all season, the first of four back-to-back situations on the season, the Lions couldn't hold down the stretch as the Broncos out-scored the Lions 23-15 after LMU tied the game at 55. "Our depth hurt us a little bit tonight," said LMU Head Coach Steve Aggers. "Santa Clara seemed to be a little fresher in the final 12 minutes of the game tonight, and their experience showed in the execution of their offense. It was the first time we played a Friday-Saturday game. It is just as emotional as physical to be successful in back-to-back game situations. We will learn and get better." Senior captain **Elton Mashack** led LMU (5-10, 1-1) with 19 points, and became the 26th player in school history to score 1,000 career points. **Marcus Smith** added a career-high 17 points for LMU. Santa Clara's Steve Ross poured in 17 of his game high 22 points in the second half for the Broncos (9-8, 1-1). Ross added 11 rebounds for the double-double. Reserve guard Kyle Bailey equaled a career-high with 17 points, while Brian Jones added 12 points, 7 rebounds, and 5 assists. Smith's running jumper tied the game 55-55 with 6:16 remaining, but the Broncos responded with an 8-2 run, capped by Jamie Holmes' free throw with 4:00 left to give the Broncos a 63-57 lead. The Lions got no closer than five points the remainder of the game. "Ross and Bailey were outstanding tonight," said Aggers. "We played very well tonight and our kids showed a lot of toughness. Our defense has to play better and for us to win we have to keep our opponents in the low 60s." LMU's **Robert Davis** hit three 3-point baskets in the final 3:50 of the first half, including a 35-footer at the buzzer, to give LMU a 29-28 halftime lead. Ross hit a 3-point basket on the Broncos' first possession of the second half, and Santa Clara never trailed the rest of the game.

GAME #16 - Pepperdine 81, LMU 65

It was a one man show and the Loyola Marymount men's basketball team did everything they could to over come it. Pepperdine junior guard Brandon Armstrong scored 40 points to lead Pepperdine past host Loyola Marymount 81-65 in a West Coast Conference game Wednesday night at Los Angeles. In LMU Men's Basketball Release -- page 15

a game much closer than the score indicated, the Lions cut a 21-point lead to seven half way through the second half in front of 2,005 at Gersten Pavilion. The Lions committed only 13 turnovers on the night, well below the more than 20 Pepperdine forces their opponents into per game. However, the Waves hung on by finishing the game hitting 84 percent (16-of-19) free throws. Armstrong hit 12 of his first 13 field-goal attempts and finished 16-of-24 from the field, with three 3-point baskets, and 5-for-5 from the free throw line. This was Armstrong's second 40-point game in the past five games, as he scored a career high 41 against Charlotte on December 29. He is the first player to score 40 points in a WCC game since Santa Clara's Steve Nash (now with the Dallas Mavericks) scored 40 at Gonzaga on January 19, 1995. Pepperdine (11-5, 3-0) trailed 21-19 with 6:42 left in the first half before Armstrong scored eight consecutive points to spark a 19-6 run to end the first half. The Waves led 38-27 at halftime. The Lions (5-11, 1-2) used a 16-5 run to cut the deficit to 61-53 on two free throws by **Elton Mashack** with 10:09 left and got as close as 64-57 with 6:39 left. However, Armstrong scored nine consecutive points, capped by a breakaway dunk with 2:21 remaining, to give the Waves a 73-61 lead. The Waves scored the game's final six points to gradually pull away. LMU's **Greg Lakey** had 16 points to lead four Lions in double figures. The Lions made seven 3-point baskets, but Pepperdine shot .525 (31-of-59) from the field while LMU shot just 37.5 percent (24 of 64). The Lions had four players in double figures, with Mashack finishing with 10, **Robert Davis** with 14 and **Sean Mollins** had a career high 11.

GAME #17 - Pepperdine 75, LMU 54

In the first meeting between Loyola Marymount University and Pepperdine University, the Lions hard fought effort was cut short by senior guard Brandon Armstrong's 40-point effort. In the rematch at Pepperdine's Firestone Fieldhouse, Armstrong didn't need to carry his teammates, as LMU fell 75-54 in Malibu on Saturday night. The Lions, who committed a mere 13 turnovers in the teams' first meeting, had 14 by half and finished with season high 24, tying the 24 they committed against UC Irvine in the second game of the season. "Pepperdine played their best tonight," said Head Coach Steve Aggers. The Lions had their chances, causing the Waves to commit 26 fouls to the Lions' 18. It equated to 40 trips to the foul line for LMU. However, the foul line was not kind to the Lions, as they finished the game 18-for-40 (45 percent). The shooting from the field wasn't any better, as the Lions were 16-of-45 (36 percent). "We did not shot the ball well from the line, from the field, from the three-point line," said Aggers. "We worked hard and never quit. We held a team scoring more than 85 points in West Coast Conference play to 75 on their home court and outrebounded them by 2 (44-42)." Leading the way for the Lions was senior **Elton Mashack**. Already surpassing the 1,000 career point total, Mashack added a team high 15 points and 11 rebounds. The double-double was the 13th of his career, moving him into ninth place in career double-doubles. All 15 of Mashack's points came in the second half. Also scoring in double figures for the Lions was junior **Tyler McClenahan** with 10 points, a career high. Pepperdine was led by Armstrong's 17 points.

GAME #18 - LMU 71, Saint Mary's 63

Loyola Marymount University junior **Marcus Smith** turned it up with his return home to the Bay Area against Saint Mary's, as his career high 18 points led the Lions to a 71-63 win in West Coast Conference play Friday night in Moraga. Smith, who transferred from Butte College, nailed his first six shots in the first half and finished the game seven-for-eight from the field and a perfect two-for-two from the three-point line. "Man, that felt great," said Head Coach Steve Aggers. "To be successful in conference play, it is important to get tough wins on the road. We were able to get a much-needed road win once we could establish our lead and hold it in the second half." The Lions (6-12, 2-3), who broke an 11-game conference losing streak on the road, took a 38-32 advantage over Saint Mary's (2-16, 0-4) into the locker room on a 15-footer by senior Elton Mashack at the buzzer. At the half, LMU hit 60 percent of its field goals (16-of-27) and held the Gaels to no offensive rebounds. The lead changed hands six times in the first half, but once the Lions got on top at half, they never looked back. The Lions jumped up quickly for a four-point lead that opened the door for the Lion win. Smith's 14 first-half points led all players, as both teams relied on the three-pointer. The Lions went four-of-six from deep in the first half and finished the game five-for-eight (62 percent). Saint Mary's finished 7-for-21 from the three-point line. "We were very selective on our three-point shooting," said Aggers. "We didn't force any from the outside." Once the Gaels concentrated their defensive pressure on Smith and the Lions' perimeter in the second half, LMU went inside to junior **Greg Lakey** and senior **Pablo Machado**. Lakey finished the game with 14 points, sinking eight-of-nine free throws. Machado added seven, Mashack six and junior **Sean Mollins** with nine.

GAME #19 - San Francisco 67, LMU 64

Loyola Marymount University entered Saturday's contest against San Francisco thin at the post position and with both big men fouling out early in the second, the Lions couldn't hang on to a halftime lead as they dropped a 67-64 West Coast Conference contest. The Lions (6-13, 2-4) were forced to sit senior captain and leading scorer **Elton Mashack** due to an ankle injury suffered during the week in practice. This left LMU with only senior **Pablo Machado** and junior **Greg Lakey** to play the post. Lakey picked up his fifth foul with 7:23 left, while Machado left the game with his fifth at the 1:39 mark. The Lions were called for 24 fouls, compared to San Francisco's (8-13, 1-5) 18. "Foul trouble obviously hurt us tonight," said Aggers. "Despite the foul trouble and our leading scorer and captain on the bench, we put ourselves in the position to win this game. I am very proud of our team." LMU held a 61-60 lead with 51 seconds remaining in the game when USF's James Lee hit two of his game high 19 to put the Dons up 62-61. LMU setup a play for junior **Philipp Czernin** that resulted in a controversial block against the glass with 33 seconds left. The Lions were forced to foul and Lee hit both free throws to give the Dons a three-point lead. Lee finished the game 10-for-10 from the free throw line. LMU set up a play to give junior **Sean Mollins** an open look at a three from the left wing that bounced off the rim. "I am proud of our defensive effort tonight," said Aggers. "The heart of our players kept us in the ball game and gave us a chance to win it." The Lions took a 37-35 lead into half on a lay-up by junior **Eurskine Robinson** as time expired. However, USF went on a run to start the second and took a 60-53 lead with six minutes remaining. At that point, the Lions defense tightened. LMU went on an 8-0 run that was capped by a three-pointer by junior **Robert Davis** and a free throw by **Pablo Machado** to give LMU a one-point lead with 2:56 remaining. Both teams went scoreless for nearly two minutes before Lee gave USF the lead for good. Davis finished the game with team-high 16 points followed by Machado with 15 and five rebounds. The Lions finished the game outrebounding USF 34-31.

GAME #20 - LMU 81, PORTLAND 69

The Loyola Marymount University men's basketball team finds themselves in a position that the program has not been in for a while—atop the conference standing. The Lions defeated the University of Portland, 81-69, in front of 2,084 Friday night at Gersten Pavilion to move into a fourth place tie with San Diego in the West Coast Conference standings. The Lions improve to 7-13 overall and 3-4 in the West Coast Conference with the win, while Portland falls to 9-11 overall and 2-5 in WCC play. In a major turnaround from the 1999-00 campaign in which the Lions failed to earn a win in conference play, LMU finds themselves in a position that isn't too big of a surprise to head coach Steve Aggers, who is in his first year with the Lions. Portland took a 32-30 lead into halftime thanks to the team's 56 percent shooting (14-25) from the field. The hot shooting was led by Adam Quick's three three-pointers. In the half, the Pilots hit 4-of-8 from the arch. Coming into the second half, the game went back and fourth with two lead changes and four ties. However, in the second half, junior **Marcus Smith** took over. After earning a career high 18 against Saint Mary's just one week ago, Smith duplicated the effort with 14 second half points to finish with another 18-point game. In addition, the junior finished with five assists, two steals and was a perfect 4-of-4 from the free throw line, all coming in the final minute of play to seal the win. Smith was part of the Lions' 8-0 run at the 13:51 mark of the second half that distance between them and the Pilots. The run was capped **Philipp Czernin**'s lay-up at 12:43 that put the score at 54-45. LMU did not look back, finishing with the game's final five points to post the 12-point win. Following Smith was the junior Czernin with 13, senior **Pablo Machado** with 12 and junior **Greg Lakey** with 10. LMU won the battle of the boards outrebounding Portland by a 40-27 margin. The Lions were impressive from the free-throw line shooting 87.5% for the game (14-16). The Lions' Smith and junior **Eurskine Robinson** were perfect from the charity stripe as they each went 4-for-4 on the night, all coming in the games final minutes.

GAME #21 - Gonzaga 84, LMU 64

Loyola Marymount University was facing an uphill battle, as they entered their showdown against the West Coast Conference's first place team, Gonzaga, without top reserve **Greg Lakey** and senior captain **Elton Mashack** at only 70 percent due to injuries. The Lions kept it close early, trailing by only four with six minutes left in the first half, but the Bulldogs' Casey Calvary scored 19 points and Dan Dickau added 16 points and 7 assists to lead Gonzaga to an 84-64 West Coast Conference victory Saturday night in Los Angeles. "Gonzaga showed why they are the top team in the conference right now," said head coach Steve Aggers. "Once they put some separation between us, they never allowed

us to get back into a run to get back into it. They executed well and got the ball to who they needed to." The Bulldogs (16-5, 8-0) used a 14-1 run and held the Lions without a field goal for a seven-minute stretch, in which they broke a 27-27 tie and took a 41-28 lead with 18:32 remaining in the game. The Bulldogs maintained a double-digit lead throughout the rest of the game, with the 20-point final margin being the game's largest. Mashack led LMU (7-14, 3-5) with 13 points and 10 rebounds to record his 14th career double-double, tied with Terrell Lowry for eighth best in school history. "Elton showed a lot of heart tonight. He was only about 70 percent and still earned a double-double," said Aggers. "We were very thin up front. I felt bad for Greg, he gave us a solid outing the night before and was playing well. We are in the beginning stages of our rebuilding and we have to learn from games like tonight." Gonzaga shot 65 percent from the field (32 of 49) and made 8 of 17 three-point attempts, while limiting the Lions to 38 percent from the field (23 of 61) and 4-of-15 from long range. The first half featured five ties and two lead changes before the Bulldogs pulled away. The Lions managed to outrebound the WCC's top rebounding team, 34-33, including 19 offensive rebounds. "We grab 19 offensive rebounds and they still beat us by 20 points," said Aggers. "I am proud of our team's effort tonight. There is no question we played the best team in the conference, we just have to learn and move on. We have a lot of basketball left to play and we are still in the middle of a battle among the top four in this league. That says a lot about this team." **Pablo Machado** and **Marcus Smith** scored 11 points, and **Robert Davis** added 10 points for the Lions.

Game #22 - Santa Clara 74, LMU 66

The "Heart of a Lion" was evident for Loyola Marymount University, as the Lions battle their way back from a 17-point deficit to Santa Clara in a West Coast Conference battle Thursday night. The comeback fell short, however, as the Lions lose for the second time to the Broncos by eight points, this time 74-66 in Santa Clara. The Lions (7-15, 3-6), who fell to Santa Clara 78-70 in Los Angeles on Jan. 13, trailed 33-27 at halftime and saw the Broncos (14-10, 6-3) lead increase to 17 with 11:18 to play in the second half. Turnovers hurt the Lions in the first half with, finishing the game with a total of 23. However, the sloppy play was on both sides, as the Lions had a season-high 12 steals to force Santa Clara into 21 turnovers. The Lions showed it's heart, overcoming the turnovers and the absence of the team's third leading scorer, junior **Greg Lakey**, due to injury, to crawl back into the game. The Lions went on a 20-5 run in the second half to tie the score at 58-58 with 3:47 minutes to play. In the run by the Lions, junior **Robert Davis** scored four of his 10 points and junior **Tyler McClenahan** hit three of his 10 points with 10:16 minutes to play to cut the lead to 12. Junior **Sean Mollins**, who finished the game with nine points, hit a 15-footer to cap the run and tie the game. However, Jamie Holmes, who finished with a game-high 26 points, hit a three-pointer on the Broncos next trip down the court for the 59-56 lead. Santa Clara would hold on the next Lions' offensive possession and get a three-point play by Brian Jones for the 64-58 lead. That would be as close as the Lions would get, as Santa Clara would hit key free throws down the stretch to seal the eight point win. game. The Lions also had seven rebounds from Davis, a team-high 11 points from **Marcus Smith** and a seven-point, 10-rebound performance by senior **Pablo Machado**.

Game #23 - San Diego 80, LMU 62

The Loyola Marymount University men's basketball team's bid for a second straight upset of the University of San Diego came up short, as the Toreros earned revenge for an early season upset to the Lions, defeating LMU 80-62 at the Jenny Craig Pavilion on Saturday night. Injuries and foul trouble once again left the Lions bench thin, as LMU continues to play with only seven scholarship players and three walk-ons. The game did not favor the Lions thin bench, as the game featured 58 fouls, 29 for the Lions and 29 for the Toreros. It was a season high for the Lions. Already without junior big man **Greg Lakey**, LMU had to sit **Marcus Smith**, **Sean Mollins** and **Eurskine Robinson** due to early foul trouble. Mollins fouled out of the game, while Smith and Robinson finished with four each. Loyola Marymount drops to 7-16 overall and 3-7 in the WCC, while USD improves to 13-10 and 5-5. "It was a very physical game tonight," said head coach Steve Aggers. "San Diego did a great job in playing a physical game and it hurt us. With our depth, we cannot get into that type of game. But credit San Diego. They beat us on the boards and had fewer turnovers. They did the things an experienced will do to win games." Unable to get into a rhythm, the experienced Toreros took advantage, led by senior Tyler Field, who finished with a game high 22 points. Leading the Lions in scoring for the seventh time this season was junior **Robert Davis**, who finished with 14 points. Also in double figures for the Lions was junior **Philipp Czernin** with 11 points, most coming from his 7-of-8 effort from the free throw line. For the game, the Lions shot 83 percent from the line (24-of-29).

USD wasn't far off, hitting 82 percent, 27-of-33. An 11-0 run to start the game by USD, including scoring on their first five possessions, held in the first half, as the Lions trailed by 11 at halftime. The Lions once again struggled from the field in the stretch, missing on their first eight possessions and finishing the game hitting 18-of-55 shots (32 percent). After committing 23 turnovers the previous game against Santa Clara, the Lions had a season low nine turnovers, but were outrebounded 39-30. However, they outrebounded the Toreros 13-11 on the offensive glass.

Game #24 - GONZAGA 101, LMU 68

Loyola Marymount University found out first hand why Gonzaga is a top the West Coast Conference and one of the hottest teams in the country, as the Lions fall to the Bulldogs 101-68 in Spokane, Wash. How hot are the Bulldogs, who improve to 19-5 and 11-0 with the win? It was their school record 13th consecutive win and once they got the lead above 10, they never looked back. For only the second time this season, the Lions (7-17, 3-8) did not lead in a game, as Gonzaga took control of the contest from the outset. Gonzaga jumped out to a 22-point lead at halftime thanks to a three-pointer at the buzzer by Dan Dickau. It typified the evening for the Lions, who once again fought foul trouble in piling up 26 team fouls, three shy of the season high they set last week at San Diego. Both junior **Sean Mollins**, who had been suffering with the flu all week, and senior **Pablo Machado** fouled out of the game before the six minute mark in the second half. The foul trouble allowed **Sherman Gay** finish with a career game. As the lone freshman on the Lions' roster and a key part of LMU's "dynamic future," Gay finished the game with a career high 11 points and another career high five rebounds. He becomes the 10th player this season to have finished the game in double figures. Also in double figures for the Lions was junior **Robert Davis**, who led the team in scoring for the eighth time this season with 13 points. Junior **Tyler McClenahan** finished with 12 and was 4-for-5 from three-point line. Senior **Elton Mashack** had his 14th game of the season in double digits with 10. It is the 16th game this season three or more players have finished in double figures for the Lions, which was the first time for this very unexpected player combination.

Game #25 - LMU 91, Portland 87

The rebuilding of the Loyola Marymount University men's basketball program took another big step Saturday night, as the Lions defeated the University of Portland 91-87 to move into a tie for fifth place in the West Coast Conference standings heading into the final weekend of play. The four-point win is a big boost for the surging Lions' program under the guidance of first year head coach Steve Aggers. The Lions (8-17, 4-8) find themselves crawling up the WCC standings thanks to a gritty performance on the road to end a four-game losing streak, fighting through three players fouling out and leaving the Lions bench to four scholarship players and three walk-ons. The sweep of Portland (10-15, 3-9) is the first of a conference opponent for the Lions since sweeping Pepperdine in the 1996 season. The game featured 57 fouls, helping the Lions to score their highest point total of the season, hitting 32-of-43 shots from the free throw line. Loyola Marymount converted seven-of-nine free throw attempts in the final 52 seconds and finished the second half 24-of-32. **Robert Davis** led the Lions with 17 points, while **Elton Mashack** and **Greg Lakey** each scored 15. All three led the Lions from the field, guiding the Lions to their best shooting percentage from the field of the season. The Lions finished the game 29-of-49 from the field (59.2%) and outrebounded Portland 33-27. The Pilots were 15-of-28 from the field in the second half and finished at 47.3%, and themselves were 27-of-37 at the free throw line in the game. Mashack finished the game 6-for-11 from the field, while Davis was 6-for-9 and Lakey had his best game since his injury two weeks ago in the last game against Portland was 4-for-5. After taking a 45-31 lead at halftime due to LMU's blistering 69.2 percent first-half shooting display, Portland outscored LMU 56-46 in the second half. The Pilots got to within 78-76 with 2:42 left, but the Lions responded with a 9-5 scoring edge over the next two minutes to go back up 87-81.

Game #26 - San Francisco 73, LMU 60

Loyola Marymount University returned home to Gersten Pavilion with a big opportunity to continue an unexpected climb up the West Coast Conference standings against the University of San Francisco. However, USF's Darrell Tucker scored 26 points and Hondre Brewer had 14 points and 6 blocks as San Francisco defeated host Loyola Marymount 73-60 in a West Coast Conference game Friday night. "This past week we had the three best practices we have had all year," said head coach Steve Aggers. "We had a very inspirational win on the road against Portland and we thought we could put all of this together and use it as a spring board. Instead we came out flat as a pancake." The Dons LMU Men's Basketball Release -- page 17

(12-16, 5-8) shot 55.6 percent from the field, including 69 percent (20 of 29) in second half as San Francisco overcame a 27-25 halftime deficit. The Lions (8-18, 4-9) committed just nine turnovers, but shot a season-low 30.2 percent from the field. **Elton Mashack** scored 12 points and **Pablo Machado** added 11 points and 8 rebounds for LMU. The Lions are in sixth place in the conference, while USF secures at least a tie for fifth. Brewer, who now has 194 career blocks surpassing the WCC record of 192 held by Gonzaga forward Casey Calvary, was a force inside, causing the Lions to change many of their shots. "Brewer was a force and changed a lot of shots," said Aggers. "We became defensive about our shooting and starting looking over our shoulders to where he would be. At 7-foot with those long arms, he is a real force." USF led 42-41 before going on a 27-8 run, during which the Dons made eight consecutive field-goal attempts from the field, to take a 69-51 lead capped by Brewer's layup with 3:05 remaining. "We have to turn it around for Saint Mary's and senior night," said Aggers.

Game #27 - LMU 65, Saint Mary's 61

Loyola Marymount University scored the game's last 11 points over the final five minutes to defeat St. Mary's in a West Coast Conference game Saturday night at LMU. The Lions (9-18, 5-9) finished WCC play in a tie for fifth place and will play Santa Clara in the first round of the conference tournament next Saturday at San Diego. The Gaels (2-26, 0-14) lost their 19th consecutive game and will play top-seed Gonzaga. "I am proud of the effort of our team tonight," said head coach Steve Aggers, who in his first season with the Lions and began a major rebuilding project that saw LMU go from eighth to fifth in one season. "We showed great maturity tonight. Earlier in the season we struggled to come from behind and close out games for wins. We did the things we needed to do to win down the stretch." LMU was led by **Marcus Smith**, who scored a career-high 19 points. Reserve **Greg Lakey** scored 13 points, including 11 of the Lions' final 17 points. The Gaels led 34-32 at halftime and Teohn Connor's three 3-point baskets in a two-minute span gave St. Mary's a 60-52 lead with 6:29 remaining. However, the Lions' defense forced the Gaels to miss their final nine field-goal attempts. "We showed great defensive intensity to climb back into the game," said Aggers, whose Lions earned a season-high seven blocks, including four by Lakey. Freshman **Sherman Gay** earned valuable minutes, setting a career high with three steals. He was playing for injured **Sean Mollins**, who is out for the season after suffering a broken right thumb against San Francisco. Lakey hit one-of-two free throws to give LMU a 62-61 lead with 2:04 left. The Gaels trailed 64-61 in the closing seconds when Jevon Harris missed a layup. LMU's **Pablo Machado** grabbed the rebound and was fouled. Machado made one-of-two free throws with 14 seconds left to preserve the victory. St. Mary's had three players in double figures, led by Ross Benson had 13 points and team-high 7 rebounds.

Game #28 - Santa Clara 77, LMU 60

The Lions concluded an incredible turn-around season on a down note, losing to Santa Clara 77-60 in the first round of the West Coast Conference Tournament in San Diego on March 3. The sixth-seeded Lions (9-19) fell down early and could never recover to the third-seeded Broncos (19-11). "I am really proud of our team and the way we played this season. I felt we overachieved and accomplished some good things," said head coach Steve Aggers, "but credit Santa Clara tonight. They are an outstanding program and they executed their game plan very well tonight." The Broncos finished the first half-shooting 15-for-30 from the field (50 percent), including 4-for-10 from the three-point line. "Once they got the lead on us, they became very methodical and control the game," said Aggers. "I was disappointed in our intensity in the first three minutes of the game. Once we regained our defensive composure we had to fight our way back but could never get over the hump." Santa Clara finished the game shooting 42 percent (26-for-61) from the field and only 23 percent from long range (5-for-21). The Lions finished 23-for-55 (41 percent), but hit only 12-of-21 free throws (57 percent). Forward Jaime Holmes led the Broncos first half attack with 11 of his 15 total points. He finished with a double-double, grabbing 10 rebounds. Guard Brian Jones led the Broncos with 20 points. The Lions entered the half down 12, 40-28 and fell down by as many as 16 at the 18:55 mark of the second half. However, LMU fought back to cut the lead to only seven at the 12:52 mark on a three-pointer by **Eurskine Robinson**. The Broncos would score the next six points on lay-ups by Jones, Justin Holbrook and David Emslie to regain the double-digit lead for good. The future looks bright for the Lions, who had two junior guards lead the way in scoring against the Broncos. **Robert Davis**, the team's leading scorer with more than 12 points per game, finished with 14. All-WCC honorable mention selection **Marcus Smith** finished with 12 points.
