LIONS HAVE HIGH HOPES FOR NCAA TOURNAMENT BERTH AFTER GOOD SHOWING AT WCC TOURNAMENT

JUST RECENTLY...The Loyola Marymount women's basketball team proved itself a force to be reckoned with after nearly bringing home its first ever WCC tournament champions trophy and its first ever bid to the NCAA tournament. The Lions fell just short in their first ever WCC championship game appearance as Saint Mary's slipped by the Lions, 53-58. LMU made it to the finals after defeating San Diego, 63-53, in Round 1 and San Francisco, 73-56, in the semifinals.

WILHOIT NAMED WCC COACH OF THE YEAR...Head Coach Julie Wilhoit captured the WCC Coach of the Year Award for the second straight season this year. Wilhoit, who is in her sixth season at the helm of the women's basketball program at LMU, led the Lions to a record breaking season. Under her direction, LMU set new school records for single-season overall wins (21) and single-season conference wins (10). She has led the Lions to a 21-9 overall record, a 10-4 mark in conference play, to within a game of LMU's first ever regular-season conference championship and to their first appearance in the WCC tournament championship game. She was the first LMU women's basketball coach to earn the top coaching nod last year, the first to have earned in consecutive seasons at LMU and only the second coach in WCC history to garner the award two straight years. She was named the fourth head coach in the program's history on June 30, 1995. Wilhoit came to LMU after a two-year stint at the University of Pittsburgh-Bradford. With the Lions, she holds a 62-105 (.371) overall record and 27-63 (.300) record in West Coast Conference play. Wilhoit is in her 13th year as a head coach and owns a 183-175 (.511) overall record.

THREE LIONS EARN ALL-CONFERENCE HONORS...Senior guard Taryn Reynolds and junior guard Bryn Britton brought home All-WCC first team honors while sophomore forward Kate Murray was named All-WCC honorable mention. Reynolds, a 5-7 native of Los Angeles, Calif., brought home her first ever first-team award and did it convincingly as she earned the award by a unanimous decision. The senior has been LMU's pillar of leadership in her final season averaging a solid 12.5 points, 4.6 rebounds and 2.9 assists for the season. She reached a milestone in her career earlier this season by being the eighth women's basketball player in school history to reach the 1,000 point plateau. Britton, who stands at 5-11 and hails from Porterville, Calif., earned her second straight first-team award. She leads the Lions in scoring and assists averaging 15.0 points and 3.6 assists per game. Britton has helped LMU's rebounding efforts as well, her 5.6 rebounds per game is second on the team. Like Reynolds, she also reached the 1,000 point milestone earlier this season. Britton was the seventh women's basketball player in school history to achieve the feat. Murray, a 6-0 native of Tigard, Oreg., collects her first career all-conference award. Her consistent play has been key to LMU's success this season. She is averaging a steady 13.1 points per game, second on the team, has recorded three double-doubles and has scored in double-digit point figures in 25 of the 30 games this season.

POSTSEASON HONORS KEEP COMIN'...Following the all-conference awards, the postseason honors just keep rolling in for the Lions. After an incredible run in the WCC tournament that began with LMU's first tournament win (63-53 over San Diego) and ended with its first championship game appearance, senior guard Taryn Reynolds and junior guard Bryn Britton added another award to their growing list of accomplishments. The starting guard combo was named to the WCC All-Tournament team, the first all-tournament selections for the Lions in program history. Reynolds finished the tournament with 32 points and 13 rebounds while Britton collected 54 points, 18 rebounds, 13 assists and 9 steals. Sophomore Kate Murray also racked up another award. The 6-foot forward was named to the WCC All-Academic team for her accomplishments in the classroom. Her 3.84 GPA ranked the highest among the 10 selections of the women's all-academic team.

THE VOTES ARE IN...For the first time since the 1988-89 season the LMU women's basketball team is receiving votes in this weeks ESPN/USA Today Top-25 coaches poll. The 88-89 Lions finished the year 17-11 overall and 9-5 in the WCC. This year, LMU hopes that its record breaking season, a top-50 RPI rating all year and some big wins throughout the course of the year could propel the Lions into the NCAA Tournament for the first time ever.

LIONS AMONG WCC ELITE...LMU has worked its way up the ladder and has instilled itself as one of the conference's top teams. Proof of this comes in the fact that the Lions are in among the WCC stats leaders in almost every category. All-WCC first-team and WCC all-tournament team member Bryn Britton is among the best in the conference in six different categories. The junior guard is third in scoring (14.8 ppg), fifth in assists (3.62 apg), seventh in free-throw percentage (71-94, .755), tenth in steals (1.45 spg), ninth in 3-pointer made (1.28 pg) and eighth in defensive rebounds (4.45 rpg). Senior Taryn Reynolds, also a first-team All-WCC and WCC all-tournament pick, ranks among the WCC's best as well. The 5-7 guard is the conference's 11th best scorer (12.7 ppg), ranks tenth in assists (2.97 apg) and second in steals (2.21 spg). Freshman center Adrienne Slaughter has made a huge first impression. The 6-2 rookie currently leads the WCC in blocked shots (1.62 bpg) this season. Her 10.3 points per game ranks 17th in the conference while also ranking third in field goal percentage (119-220, .541), eighth in total rebounds (203) and second in offensive rebounds (95).

PROTECTING THE LIONS' DEN...The Lions were very protective of their home court this season as they posted an 11-2 mark while playing at Gersten Pavilion. The Lions recently swept their final home games of the 2000-01 season defeating Gonzaga (60-37) and Portland (70-52). It has been almost 10 years since LMU posted 11 home wins. The 1992-93 Lions were the last team to post an 11-2 record at home, a mark which is the second best home record in program history. The most home wins ever recorded by a Lion team was 12 accomplished by the 1989-90 team.

A RECORD BREAKING SEASON...The Lions have set a new program record for single-season wins with a 21-9 overall record and a new single-season conference wins mark with a 10-4 WCC record. This is LMU's first 20 win season in program history. The 1988-89 team previously held both the overall wins and conference wins records, going 17-11 overall and 9-5 in conference that year.

CRASHING THE BOARDS...A big key to LMU's success this season has been its relentless rebounding effort. As a team the Lions have collectively outrebounded their opponents time and time again. LMU is averaging 38.7 rebounds per game to its opponents 35.9 boards per game, a difference of nearly 3 more rebounds in the Lions favor. The Lions are 18-2 when outthrusting their opponents to the boards and 3-7 when the opposite occurs. LMU's three other wins (21 total) can be attributed to forced errors. In those wins, LMU's ferocious defense drove its opponents to committing more turnovers than the Lions. On the season, LMU averaged 15.9 turnovers per game while its opponents had 17.7 errors per game.

RECORDS WERE MADE TO BE BROKEN...Along with the team records that LMU has set this year, several Lions have set new individual records. Junior Bryn Britton, freshman Adrienne Slaughter and senior Taryn Reynolds have been busy rewriting the record books. Britton, a 5-11 guard, set a new single-season scoring mark for juniors with 450 points. Earlier this season she tied the single-game record for 3-pointers draining six against No. 23 Xavier (11/25/00) and during conference play she set a new single-game scoring record for juniors with 31 points against Saint Mary's (1/26/01). Britton is now the all-time career leader in field goals made (580) and 3-point field goals made (87) and ranks second on the all-time scoring chart with 1,234 career points. Freshman Adrienne Slaughter has started her young career on the right foot as she has also etched her name into the LMU record books. The 6-2 center went 7-for-7 (1.000) against Fresno State (12/5/00) setting a new single-game field goal percentage mark with the most attempts. Slaughter also owns the all-time freshman rebounds record with 211 on the year. Reynolds, a 5th-year senior, has gotten into the action as well. She sunk a team-best 122 free-throws this season making her LMU's all-time career free-throws leader with 375. Reynolds ranks fourth on the all-time scoring chart (1,111), third on the career steals list (220) and third in 3-point field goals made (74).

BRITTON AND REYNOLDS REACH 1,000 CAREER POINTS...Senior guard Taryn Reynolds and junior guard Bryn Britton have both hit milestones in their careers this season by reaching the 1,000 point plateau. Reynolds, a 5-7 native of Los Angeles, Calif., went over the 1,000 point mark with the 10 points she picked up in Portland (Feb. 1). Reynolds' career points total now stands at 1,111 and ranks 5th on the all-time LMU charts. Britton, a 5-11 junior from Porterville, Calif., hit her 1,000th career point earlier this season with the 10 points she dropped at Pepperdine (Jan. 20). Britton currently has 1,234 career points, a mark which is 2nd in the LMU career record book. Both athletes were honored by the West Coast Conference as Players of the Week this season. Reynolds earned the award the week of Jan. 22 and began an LMU trend of snagging the award. Britton continued the trend garnering the award in the following week (Jan. 29).

INJURY REPORT...The Lions are beginning to look like a M*A*S*H unit. Freshman Raelen Self is LMU's third casualty of the season. She will sit out the remainder of the season after undergoing surgery to repair a break in her right hand. She joins sophomore center Shannon Wosman and junior guard Rosa Bernasconi who are also sidelined the rest of the season. Both will sit out the remainder of the year due to ACL injuries suffered earlier this season. The Lions lost Wosman during the game at Santa Clara (Jan. 13) and then lost Bernasconi just six days later at Pepperdine (Jan. 20).

BEST WCC FINISH IN 10 YEARS...The Lions, 10-4 in conference play, finished the regular season in third place, their best finish in 10 years. The 1989-90 season was the last time the Lions finished among the upper tier conference teams. That year, under the direction of then-head coach Todd Corman, LMU posted a 7-7 WCC record and finished tied for third in the conference with San Diego.

WCC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME REVIEW...LMU fell, 53-58, to Saint Mary's College in the championship game of the West Coast Conference tournament in Jenny Craig Pavilion. It was the first ever championship game appearance for the Lions, who ended the tournament with a 21-9 record, a new school record. First-team All-WCC pick and all-tournament selection Bryn Britton led LMU with a 22-point effort. The Lions, who were 0-6 in tournament play before this season, collected its first ever postseason win with a 63-53 victory over San Diego in Round 1. LMU continued its winning ways and insured an appearance in the championship game with a 73-56 win over San Francisco in the semifinals. LMU fell behind 0-5 to start the game before junior guard Britton put the Lions on the board draining a 3-pointer with 18:20 on the clock. LMU then went cold from the field going 1-for-9 before freshman center Adrienne Slaughter ended the drought with a bucket at the 14:33 mark of the half. Defense kept the Lions in the game and only down by seven at the 10-minute mark. They forced four Gaels turnovers and picked up two steals. LMU finished the half down 16-24 while shooting a season-low 21% on 6-of-28 from the floor. It was LMU's only sub-30% first half shooting on the season. The 16 points at the half was the lowest point total in any half all year. The lowest coming into the game was a 19 point first half effort at Gonzaga (Feb. 3). The Lions pulled out a 62-58 win that night in Spokane, Wash. The Lions trailed by as many as 10, three times, in the second half but were able chip away at the deficit. With under a minute remaining LMU was down by eight when Britton hit one of her three 3-pointers to cut the lead to just five (46-51). Freshman forward Michele Brown drained only her second 3-pointer of the season with 20 seconds left to bring the Lions within four (51-55). The LMU rally continued as freshman center Adrienne Slaughter came up with a huge offensive rebound and put away a short 3-foot jumper to make it a one possession game with 13 seconds left in the game. That would be as close as the Lions came though as SMC's Katie Davis made it a two-possession game sinking 1-of-2 free throws as the Gaels held on to the 58-53 win. "We were just excited to be here," said head coach Julie Wilhoit. "We played a great team tonight and I am so proud of the effort exerted by our team, not just this game or the tournament but all season. We have learned to fight through adversity and we are by no means through." Britton finished the game with her game-high 22 points, 5 rebounds, 4 assists and 4 steals. She posted 54 total points throughout the tournament, an LMU WCC tournament record. Slaughter was LMU's only other double-digit scorer ending the night with 12 points on 6-of-10 shooting from the floor, 8 boards, 1 assist, 1 steal and 1 block. Senior guard Taryn Reynolds was LMU's other all-tournament team member. She finished the tournament 32 points. With its first 20+ win season under its belt LMU now looks to its first ever NCAA tournament bid. An RPI rating among the 40 best in the country, key wins over some of the country's best teams and its best WCC tournament showing ever could propel the Lions into the national spotlight. "I think we have a shot," stated Wilhoit. "With 21 wins, some of which came against nationally recognized teams, and playing in one of the toughest conferences around; we will land somewhere. By no means is the end of the road for us."

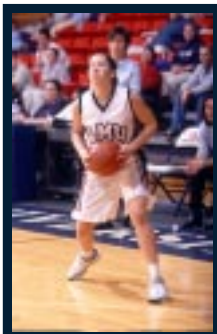
