Just Briefly

The Loyola Marymount men's soccer team faces its busiest week of the 2000 season with three games in a six-day span. The Lions are coming off a second place showing in the LMU Fall Classic at Sullivan Field last weekend. In the tournament finale on Saturday, Sept. 23 LMU pulled out a thrilling 1-0 double overtime victory against San Diego State. Junior Claudio Basaez picked an opportune time for the first goal of his collegiate career, scoring at the 110:56 mark. The Lions couldn't muster such heroics two days earlier against San Jose State, falling to the nation's 19th-ranked team 2-0.

Up Next

Loyola Marymount begins its tour of the Golden State on Tuesday, Sept. 26 at UC Santa Barbara with a 7:00 contest. Following a home game against UC Irvine on Friday, Sept. 29 at 1:00 p.m., the Lions head to Fresno State to battle the Bulldogs on Sunday, Oct. 1 in a 2:00 contest.

Cardiac Kids

Sudden death has meant sudden victory for the Lions, who are a perfect 3-0 in overtime games this season. LMU recorded consecutive OT wins against Loyola Chicago (Sept. 3) and UNLV (Sept. 8), getting "golden goals" from freshman Michael Erush and junior Nick Resich, respectively. Then last Sunday junior Claudio Basaez stuck a dagger through San Diego State's collective heart by scoring with less than 10 minutes to play in the second sudden-death period. The Lions have obviously learned their lesson from 1999, when they posted an 0-2-3 record in overtime contests.

Torres Continues Torrid Goal-Scoring Pace

Forward Arturo Torres has found the back of the net 22 times as a Lion, placing him one score shy of tying the the school record for career goals held by Jorge Rodriguez, who played at LMU from 1993-96. Oh - did we mention that Torres is only a sophomore, just 26 games into his collegiate career? The native of Wilmington, Calif., also ranks second all-time at LMU in career points (51), and holds the school records for goals in a season (16) as well as goals in a game (4) with his performance against Denver in 1999. Torres' six goals and 15 points this season places him second in the WCC in both categories.

Protecting the Pride

Senior goalkeeper Jerad Bailey was a busy man last week, recording 25 saves in the LMU Fall Classic including 14 against SDSU en route to All-Tournament honors. By blanking the Aztecs 1-0, Bailey raised his school record for career shutouts to 13 and lowered his goals against average for the season to 1.02 - over a full goal lower than his 1999 mark. The Redlands, Calif., native currently leads all Division I keepers with 56 stops, ranking him third in saves per game at 8.0. The Lion defense as a whole has stepped up this year, allowing just nine goals through eight contests. LMU has been particularly stingy in the second half of games, surrendering just two scores and 49 shots.

LMU Head Coach

Paul Krumpe enters his third season at the helm of the LMU men's soccer program. In 1999 he guided the Lions to their best overall record (8-8-3) in nearly twenty years and earned WCC Coach of the Year honors. A 1986 graduate of UCLA, Krumpe came to LMU after spending three seasons as an assistant with the Bruins. During those seasons, he helped lead UCLA to a record of 56-9-1, three NCAA regional appearances, three Mountain Pacific Sports Federation titles and a national championship in 1997. As a player for UCLA, Krumpe was a four year starter (1982-85), co-captain of the 1985 NCAA Championship team and a two-time All-Far West Region selection. He also has extensive international experience, playing in over 40 games with Team USA including the 1988 Summer Olympics.

Gaucha Gossip

UC Santa Barbara (3-5-0) heads into Tuesday's showdown with the Lions looking to end a four-game losing skid. Most recently the Gauchos lost 2-0 at top-ranked UCLA on Sept. 24 despite outshooting the Bruins 5-2 in the first half. Senior Thaigo Martins and sophomore Jamie Ambriz lead Head Coach Tim Vom Steeg's team with four points apiece. LMU is 4-8-0 all-time against Santa Barbara but has won the past four meetings, including a 3-1 decision at Sullivan Field last season.

Anteater Announcements

UC Irvine is playing some of its best soccer in years, boasting a 6-2-0 record with four shutout wins including a 1-0 triumph over Gonzaga on Sept. 23. The Anteaters, ranked 10th in the West Region by the NSCAA, look to junior Jon Spencer (11 points) to provide a scoring punch. Loyola Marymount and UCI last locked horns on Oct. 1, 1999 with the game ending in a 3-3 tie. Irvine leads the all-time series 9-4-1.

Scouting the Bulldogs

Another team enjoying early-season success is Fresno State, which sits at 5-1-1 following a win and a tie in the UMass Tournament last weekend. The Bulldogs feature a balanced offensive attack with six players scoring four or more points this year. FSU thumped the Lions 10-1 in the last meeting between the two schools on Nov. 11, 1994 and is 2-0 all-time vs. LMU.
