Just Briefly

The Loyola Marymount men's soccer team, currently ranked eighth in the Far West by the National Soccer Coaches' Association of America, faces an important West Coast Conference test this Sunday in its final home game of the 2000 regular season. The Lions extended their current unbeaten streak to four games (3-0-1) with a 2-1 come-from-behind nonconference victory over Cal State Northridge last Sunday, Oct. 29 at a soggy Sullivan Field. Sophomore forward Arturo Torres provided the heroics by scoring his third game-winning goal of the year with less than three minutes remaining in regulation. The Wilmington, Calif., native also assisted on senior forward Spencer Reeves' game-tying goal in the first half. That atoned for a strange play in the 11th minute in which LMU kicked the ball into its own net, giving CSUN a 1-0 lead. The victory over the Matadors was Loyola Marymount's 10th in 2000, establishing a new school record for victories in a season.

Up Next

The Lions conclude their 2000 home schedule this Sunday, Nov. 4 with a 2:00 p.m. showdown against West Coast Conference rival Gonzaga. Seniors Jaret Asuncion, Jerad Bailey and Spencer Reeves will be honored for their contributions to the program prior to kickoff. Looking ahead, LMU plays its final regular season game on Saturday, Nov. 11 at Santa Clara. That WCC clash will begin at 7:30 p.m.

Senior Salute

Sunday's clash with Gonzaga will mark the final home game at Sullivan Field in the careers of Lion seniors Jaret Asuncion, Jerad Bailey and Spencer Reeves. Asuncion, a midfielder, has started 44 of 64 games over the past four seasons and amassed 14 points, including an assist on Torres's game-winner last Sunday. Reeves has etched his name in the LMU record books, ranking eighth all-time with 25 career points. The forward's finest season came in 1999 when he recorded 12 points, including a team-best six assists. Bailey, whose exploits are detailed below, will leave Westchester as perhaps the best goalkeeper in school history, owning school records for both career shutouts (14) and goals against average (1.66).

Comeback Kids

Formerly dubbed the "Cardiac Kids" because of their undefeated 6-0-1 mark in overtime this season, the Lions have earned their new moniker by rallying from behind in three of their past four games, all victories. After Saint Mary's scored a goal in the opening minutes on Oct. 8, Spencer Reeves and Eric Kim found the back of the cage to give Loyola Marymount its first WCC win of the year. Then on Oct. 22 leads of 1-0 and 2-1 weren't big enough for eighth-ranked Portland as freshman Kevin Novak notched the game-tying score and "golden goal" in overtime to give LMU its biggest win this season. Against Cal State Northridge the Lions recovered from an early miscue to score two unanswered goals, the second coming from Arturo Torres at the 87:47 mark. Earlier in the season LMU rallied from two-goal deficits at UNLV (Sept. 8) and against UCI (Sept. 29) for OT victories.

Torres Tops the Charts

Only a sophomore, forward Arturo Torres already holds a combined five single-season and career Loyola Marymount scoring records. Most recently he established new Lion highwater marks for career points and assists in a season against Portland. The only record remaining on Torres' hit list is the all-time mark of 15 assists, which he is only one shy of tying. The Wilmington, Calif., native currently ranks 14th nationally in assists per game (0.64) and is second in the WCC with 32 points. Torres has scored or assisted on 21 of Loyola Marymount's 26 goals and has tallied three or more points in six different games this season.

Protecting the Pride

Senior Jerad Bailey has been the busiest goalkeeper in the country this season, leading all Division I players with 101 saves. That equates to 7.21 saves per game, fourth-best nationally. While Bailey has faced a ton of shots he hasn't let many through, boasting a goals against average of 1.44 - over half a goal lower than his 1999 mark. The Redlands, Calif., native has already matched his previous career high for shutouts in a single season with four in 2000. The Lion defense as a whole has stepped up this year, allowing just 22 goals (1.35 per game).

LMU Head Coach

Paul Krumpe enters his third season at the helm of the LMU men's soccer program. In 1999 he guided the Lions to their best overall record (8-8-3) in nearly twenty years and earned WCC Coach of the Year honors. A 1986 graduate of UCLA, Krumpe came to LMU after spending three seasons as an assistant with the Bruins. During those seasons, he helped lead UCLA to a record of 56-9-1, three NCAA regional appearances, three Mountain Pacific Sports Federation titles and a national championship in 1997. As a player for UCLA, Krumpe was a four-year starter (1982-85), co-captain of the 1985 NCAA Championship team and a two-time All-Far West Region selection. He also has extensive international experience, playing in over 40 games with Team USA including the 1988 Summer Olympics.

Scouting the Bulldogs

Gonzaga is one of two undefeated teams in WCC play, going 3-0-0 in conference and 9-5-0 overall. The Bulldogs will play at eighth-ranked San Diego on Friday before Sunday's showdown with the Lions. Jason Kuska, the reigning WCC Player of the Week, leads the conference with 2.36 points per game. Sunday's game figures to be a highly-competitive affair, as the past two meetings between Gonzaga and LMU have gone to double-overtime. The Bulldogs won both of those contests 3-2, and own a 6-1-1 record in the all-time series.
