#### Just Briefly

The Loyola Marymount men's soccer team continues its four-game road trip this weekend at the UNLV Coors Classic in Las Vegas, Nev. The Lions, ranked sixth in the Far West by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America, opened the 2000 season with a pair of shutout victories at the Jesuit Cup in Chicago. On Friday, Sept. 1, LMU shutout Detroit Mercy 2-0 as sophomore sensation Arturo Torres tallied a goal and an assist to move into second place on the school's all-time scoring list. Two days later, freshman Michael Erush scored the game-winner early in overtime to give LMU a 1-0 win over host school Loyola of Chicago and win the tournament.

#### Up Next

First up for Loyola Marymount in the Coors Classic is host UNLV on Friday, Sept. 8 at 7:00 p.m. Then on Sunday, Sept. 10 the Lions battle Tulsa at 2:00 p.m. Saint Mary's will also participate in the Coors Classic but does not have a match scheduled against fellow West Coast Conference member LMU. Loyola Marymount continues the trend of tournament play next weekend as it hosts Michigan State, Cal State Fullerton and Gonzaga in the LMU Fila Cup at Sullivan Field.

### Lions Off to Best Start Ever

For the first time in school history, Loyola Marymount has won its first two games of the season. The Lions have also posted victories in two consecutive season openers, another feat unmatched since LMU began keeping men's soccer records in 1979. LMU shutout UC Irvine 1-0 to commence its 1999 campaign.

### Torres Continues Torrid Point-Scoring Pace

Just 20 games into his Lion career, sophomore forward Arturo Torres already ranks among the all-time greats in program history. With his late goal to seal LMU's season-opening victory over Detroit Mercy, Torres moved past Dannel Christian into second place on the Loyola Marymount career points list with 39. The Wilmington, Calif., native also tied Christian for second on the all-time goal scoring list at 17. Torres, a 1999 First Team All-WCC honoree, needs just five goals and 22 points to break the school records in both categories, currently held by Jorge Rodriguez who played at LMU from 1993 to 1996.

### Freshmen Making Immediate Impact

Several LMU freshman are already logging significant playing time and contributing to the Lions' offensive attack. Midfielder Michael Erush, a starter in both games, scored the game-winning goal against Loyola of Chicago when he took Andres Murriagui's free kick and headed in into the net at the 94:50 mark of the first overtime period. Meanwhile forward Yuji Teranishi assisted on Loyola Marymount's second goal against Detroit Mercy, feeding Torres on a right cross. In addition, freshman defender Pat Parker prevented a likely Detroit goal when he stepped in front of the open net and made a defensive save during the second half.

### Goalies Form Impenetrable Wall

Through two games this season the Lion defense is pitching a shutout, thanks in no small part to the play of goalkeepers Jerad Bailey and Dan Sheridan. Against Detroit Mercy, Bailey, a senior, made four saves and extended his school record for career shutouts to 11. Two days later LMU inserted Sheridan into the lineup, and the junior responded with his third career shutout and six saves.

### LMU Head Coach

Paul Krumpke enters his third season at the helm of the LMU men's soccer program. In 1999 he guided the Lions to their best overall record (8-8-3) in nearly twenty years and earned WCC Coach of the Year honors. A 1986 graduate of UCLA, Krumpke came to LMU after spending three seasons as an assistant with the Bruins. During those seasons, he helped lead UCLA to a record of 56-9-1, three NCAA regional appearances, three Mountain Pacific Sports Federation titles and a national championship in 1997. As a player for UCLA, Krumpke was a four year starter (1982-85), co-captain of the 1985 NCAA Championship team and a two-time All-Far West Region selection. He also has extensive international experience, playing in over 40 games with Team USA including the 1988 Summer Olympics.

### Rebel Ramblings

UNLV enters the Coors Classic with a 1-0-1 record, scoring a 3-0 victory over Ohio State on Sept. 1 and playing to a scoreless tie with Notre Dame last Sunday. Junior Jason Melendez, who has led the Rebels in scoring the past two seasons, notched a goal against the Buckeyes. Head Coach Barry Barto is an institution in Las Vegas, owning a 178-137-35 record in 19-plus seasons at the school. UNLV owns a 4-1-1 all-time advantage over the Lions, winning the last meeting 2-1 on Oct. 25, 1998.

### Golden Hurricane Happenings

Tulsa will be seeking its first win of the year in the Coors Classic, having dropped its season opener to Oregon State 2-1 on Sept. 1. Last season the Golden Hurricanes finished a respectable 9-8 and placed second in the Western Athletic Conference, scoring wins over two top-25 teams. LMU and Tulsa have never met in men's soccer.
