#### Just Briefly

The Loyola Marymount men's soccer team hosts its second tournament in as many weeks as San Jose State, San Diego State and Loyola Chicago visit Sullivan Field for the LMU Fall Classic presented by Tony P's Dockside Grill beginning Thursday. The Lions finished 1-1 in the Fila Cup last weekend, shutting out Michigan State 2-0 on Sept. 15 before falling to seventh-ranked Cal State Fullerton on Sept. 17. Arturo Torres found the back of the net once in each contest, moving within one score of the LMU all-time record of 23 career goals. Torres and senior Spencer Reeves were all-tournament selections. Meanwhile senior goalkeeper Jerad Bailey made 19 saves in the Fila Cup and extended his school record for career shutouts to 12 against MSU.

#### Up Next

Nineteenth-ranked San Jose State is LMU's first opponent in the Fall Classic on Thursday, Sept. 21 at 3:00 p.m. Then on Saturday, Sept. 23 the Lions battle San Diego State in another 3:00 affair. Loyola Marymount does not have a match scheduled against Loyola Chicago, which will battle San Diego State on Thursday and San Jose State on Saturday. Both games will start at 12:30 p.m. LMU defeated the Ramblers 1-0 in overtime on Sept. 3 in Chicago.

### Lions Equal Best Start Ever

With their 4-2-0 overall record, the Lions have matched their strong start from the 1999 season. Prior to last year LMU had never posted a record better than 2-2-2 in its first six games dating back to 1979, when Loyola Marymount first began keeping men's soccer records. The Lions have proven to be the cardiac kids thusfar in 2000, winning both of their overtime games against Loyola Chicago and UNLV.

### Torres Continues Torrid Goal-Scoring Pace

Forward Arturo Torres tallied two goals in the Fila Cup, moving within one score of the school record for career goals (23) held by Jorge Rodriguez, who played at LMU from 1993-96. Oh - did we mention that Torres is only a sophomore, just 22 games into his collegiate career? The native of Wilmington, Calif., also ranks second all-time at LMU in career points (51), and holds the school records for goals in a season (16) as well as goals in a game (4) with his performance against Denver in 1999. Torres' six goals and 14 points this season lead the WCC, and his 1.00 goals per game rank 19th nationally.

### Underclassmen Gaining the Upper Hand

Ten different LMU players have scored points this season, seven of whom are underclassmen. Aside from the aforementioned Torres, sophomore Eric Kim and freshman Michael Erush have each notched game-winning goals, with Erush's score coming in overtime against Loyola Chicago. Torres and Erush have a team-leading two assists, while Kim, fellow sophomores Michael Coakley and Andres Murriagui and freshmen Yuji Terranishi and Josh Moreno have also assisted on goals. The three grizzled veterans who have scored points for the Lions are senior Spencer Reeves (one goal, one assist) and juniors Nick Resich (one goal) and Gonzalo Bonilla (one assist). LMU has just three seniors on its 24 man roster.

### Lion Defense Stepping Up

Through six games this season, Loyola Marymount has surrendered just seven goals, a marked improvement from 1999 when the Lions who had a goals against average of 1.84 per game. LMU has been particularly stingy in the second half, allowing just one score and 31 shots. A major contributor to the LMU defensive surge is senior goalkeeper Jerad Bailey, who has two shut-outs and 31 saves with a GAA of 1.08, over half a goal lower than his 1999 average.

### LMU Head Coach

Paul Krumpke enters his third season at the helm of the LMU men's soccer program. In 1999 he guided the Lions to their best overall record (8-8-3) in nearly twenty years and earned WCC Coach of the Year honors. A 1986 graduate of UCLA, Krumpke came to LMU after spending three seasons as an assistant with the Bruins. During those seasons, he helped lead UCLA to a record of 56-9-1, three NCAA regional appearances, three Mountain Pacific Sports Federation titles and a national championship in 1997. As a player for UCLA, Krumpke was a four year starter (1982-85), co-captain of the 1985 NCAA Championship team and a two-time All-Far West Region selection. He also has extensive international experience, playing in over 40 games with Team USA including the 1988 Summer Olympics.

### Spartan Stats

San Jose State enters the LMU Fall Classic boasting a perfect 5-0-0 record and No. 19 national ranking. The Spartans have shut out their past four opponents, most recently defeating San Francisco (2-0) and Sacramento State (3-0) last weekend. Senior Jorge Martinez has done a bulk of the damage, scoring seven goals and adding four assists. The Lions are winless against SJSU at 0-5-1, losing the last meeting 2-1 in overtime on Sept. 11, 1997.

### Aztec Announcements

San Diego State looks to improve upon its 2-4-0 record in this weekend's tournament. The Aztecs fell to St. Mary's 1-0 on Sept. 15 before rebounding with a convincing 5-0 win over Cal Baptist on Monday. SDSU leads the all-time series with Loyola Marymount 7-3-1, however the Lions pulled out a 1-0 victory in San Diego on Sept. 18, 1998 in the last contest between the two schools.
