Last Week

The No. 20 LMU women's volleyball team handed Indiana a quick 3-0 loss (15-9, 15-6, 15-10) to begin the Blimpie/Hoosier Invitational II in Bloomington, Ind. The Lions used the leadership of seniors Sarah McFarland and Allison Gustorf who combined for more than half of the teams 52 kills (McFarland - 17, Gustorf - 16). LMU took its undefeated streak of eight matches into Saturday's contest with Duke and suffered its first loss of the season 3-2 (15-7, 11-15, 15-11, 8-15, 11-15). McFarland pounded out an amazing 39 kills while also recording a match-high 24 digs. The Lions bounced back nicely Saturday evening as they recorded a decisive 3-0 (15-11, 15-8, 15-13) win over Marquette to claim the Blimpie/Hoosier Invitational II tournament championship. McFarland posted 30 kills in three games against the Golden Eagles, just two shy of the LMU mark for kills in a three-game match.

Both McFarland and Gustorf were named to the all-tournament team while McFarland also brought home her third consecutive tournament MVP award. She finished the weekend with a team-leading 86 kills and 51 digs.

This Week

The Lions wrap up their tournament schedule with their toughest competition yet at the 2000 Golden Dome Invitational. LMU faces off against tournament host No. 24 Notre Dame on Thursday, Sept. 21 at 7 p.m. and then moves on to meet No. 4 Colorado State Friday, Sept. 22 at 5 p.m. The Lions wrap up tournament play on Saturday, Sept. 23 against Wyoming at 5 p.m.

"Big Mac" Earns Conference Honors

Senior outside hitter Sarah McFarland was named West Coast Conference Player of the Week. She earned the recognition following her third straight MVP award at the Blimpie/Hoosier Invitational II last weekend. McFarland put up 86 kills and 51 digs to lead the team and the tournament in both categories. She collected double-doubles in all three matches and exceeded 30 kills twice. McFarland averaged an eye-opening 7.82 kills per game and 4.64 digs per game as the Lions went 2-1 in the tournament.

Lions In The Rankings

LMU, ranked at No. 20 last week, dropped two spots to No. 22 in the USA Today/AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 poll this week. The Lions fell on the AVCA/USA Today chart following their unfortunate loss to Duke at the Blimpie/Hoosier Invitational last weekend. The Lions remained strong, despite their first loss of the season, in *Volleyball Magazine's* poll, LMU continues to be listed at No. 20.

Three Lions Set Personal Bests

Despite a tough loss to Duke, three LMU Lions set new personal bests in a variety of statistical categories last weekend. Senior outside hitter Sarah McFarland recorded a match-high 24 digs against the Blue Devils, a new career-high for the 6-6 native of Michigan City, Ind. Fellow senior Allison Gustorf matched two of her career marks. The 6-0 middle blocker from Stockton, Calif. hit a blistering .667 against Indiana (16-0-24) and recorded 15 digs vs. Duke. Sophomore Jaimee Brubacher had an equally impressive outing against Indiana as the 6-0 outside hitter recorded a career-high 17 digs against the Hoosiers.

The McFarland Watch

Senior outside hitter Sarah McFarland, who is expected to land atop the NCAA statistical charts after leading the nation with 750 kills in 1999, continues her quest for the kill title. For the third consecutive weekend, she pounded out a tournament leading 86 kills while also leading the team with 51 digs. McFarland's efforts earned her Blimpie/Hoosier Invitational II MVP honors, her third of the year. The 6-6 outside hitter enters this weekends 2000 Golden Dome Invitational with 223 kills on the year.

Cruise Control

The No. 22-ranked Lions continue to improve as the year progresses and despite a bump in the road with Duke, seem to be cruising through their schedule. Six of LMU's eight victories have come in 3-0 shutouts of its opponents. The Lions have won 26 of their 32 total games and saw an 18-game winning streak snapped when the Blue Devils recorded a 15-11 win in game two of their match.

New Kids On The Block

The Lions core of newcomers has shown ability beyond their years defensively. The class of 2004 are atop the leaders in block solos, block assists and total blocks. Freshman Tiana Newsome holds the top spot in all three categories; the 5-11 native of Peoria, Ariz. currently owns seven solo blocks, 29 block assists and 36 total blocks. Newcomer Kealani Kimball, a 5-11 middle blocker from Kaunakakai, Hawai'i, falls just behind Newsome on the block solos chart with four on the year. Not to be outdone by her rookie counterparts, Nicole Oehlman has tallied 20 block assists so far this season. That total puts the 5-10 native of Sebastopol, Calif. third on the team.

Stratos Update

Head coach Steve Stratos is entering his eleventh year at the helm of the Loyola Marymount women's volleyball program. In 10 seasons at LMU, Stratos has led the Lions to seven 20-win seasons and seven postseason appearances, including four consecutive in the NCAA Championships. Including the Lions record in 2000, Stratos has posted a career total of 220-93, for a .703 winning percentage, the highest in LMU volleyball history and among current WCC coaches. In West Coast Conference action, he owns a record of 108-32, for a .771 winning percentage. With 111 career conference victories, Stratos ranks second among current WCC coaches.

Injury Update

Middle blocker Candace Boller is sidelined for the next three to four weeks as she recovers from foot surgery in the off-season. She is expected to return to the lineup for conference play.

LMU vs. Indiana (Sept. 15)

The 20th-ranked Loyola Marymount women's volleyball team has been cruising through tournaments, winning their last 14 games over a span of five matches heading into this weekends tournament at Indiana University. It was more of the same for the Lions against host Indiana. Using 17 kills from Sarah McFarland and 16 from Allison Gustorf, the Lions once again did not drop a game, defeating the Hoosiers 15-9, 15-6, and 15-10. The Lions improve to 7-0 on the season and will take on Duke and Marquette in the second and final day of the Indiana Tournament in Bloomington. Both the Hoosiers and the Lions finished the three-game match with 52 kills. However, it was the Lions .277 to .118 edge in hitting percentage that kept LMU undefeated on the season. In addition to her kills, McFarland added 16 digs and five blocks (one solo, four assist) in the win. Freshman Nicole Oehlman had 46 assists on the evening.

LMU vs. Duke (Sept. 16)

The Lions suffered their first loss of the season, 3-2, to Duke (15-7, 11-15, 15-11, 8-15, 11-15) at the Hoosier Invitational II in Bloomington, Ind. last weekend. Senior Sarah McFarland led LMU in its effort to remain undefeated with a match-high 39 kills. The Lions jumped ahead of the Blue Devils two games to one as they recorded wins in games one and three. LMU posted a .217 hitting percentage in game one and held Duke to a mere .075. The Lions managed to pull out a win in game three despite falling behind the Blue Devils in the

kill category by a 21-19 margin. Duke would not go away quietly though as it came from behind to record wins in the final two games and post its ninth win of the season. McFarland was LMU's pillar of strength yet again as she posted 39 kills while also adding 24 digs and four block assists.

LMU vs. Marquette (Sept. 16)

With LMU's 3-0 win (15-11, 15-8, 15-13) over Marquette University, the Lions were named the Blimpie/Hoosier Invitational II Champions. Seniors Sarah McFarland and Allison Gustorf earned all-tournament honors; McFarland also brought home her third consecutive MVP award. The Lions bounced back from their loss to Duke to take the decisive win over Marquette. McFarland recorded a match-high 30 kills and posted an impressive .393 hitting percentage. Sophomore Jaimee Brubacher followed McFarland with 12 kills and finished second on the team in that category.

Notes On Notre Dame

No. 24 Notre Dame will definitely give the Lions a challenge as they enter this weekend's tournament with a 7-3 overall record. The Fighting Irish are led by Kristy Kreher who has pounded out a team-leading 129 kills this season. Close behind Kreher in the kill department is Christi Girton who has posted 101 kills through 32 games played. Defensively Notre Dame is anchored by Malinda Goralski who has stuffed a total of 34 blocks and averages 1.03 blocks per game. Notre Dame is coached by Debbie Brown. In her 10 years with the Irish, Brown has compiled a 235-88 record while owning a 352-166 mark for her career. Notre Dame defeated LMU (3-0) in their only previous meeting (9/23/94).

Notes On Colorado State

The 4th-ranked Rams went undefeated in the Coors Classic last weekend defeating UMass, Loyola-Chicago and Georgia Tech improving CSU's record to 11-1 overall. The Rams are led by junior Courtney Cox who has tallied 173 kills and leads the team and the Mountain West with a 4.12 kill per game average. Junior Angela Knopf is atop the blocking chart for CSU, she has collected a total of 77 on the season. Tom Hilbert is in his fourth year at the helm of the Rams volleyball program. Hilbert, who is ranked 13th among Division I active head coaches according to winning percentage, has compiled a 266-90 career record and a 91-18 mark at CSU. LMU leads the series, 5-3, with the Rams claiming the most recent 3-0 victory last season.

Notes On Wyoming

The Cowgirls enter this weekend's tournament with 6-7 overall record and are currently enjoying a two-match winning streak. Wyoming recently ended a three-match losing skid with wins over Wisconsin-Green Bay and Loyola-Chicago. Leading the Cowgirls on the kill chart is senior Jamie Burke with 170 total kills and a 3.47 kill per game average. Setting Wyoming this season is freshman phenom Katy Brown who has accumulated 388 assists and also added a team-leading 17 service aces. At the helm of the Cowgirls volleyball program is fifth-year head coach Susan Judge. Judge has posted a 64-71 record at Wyoming and is 101-103 for her career. The Cowgirls own a 2-1 series advantage over the Lions with LMU's win (3-1) coming in 1998.
