UP NEXT...The Loyola Marymount women's basketball team returns home to begin a four game homestand. First up for the Lions is a match up against the Santa Clara Broncos on Friday, Feb. 9. It will be a battle for the top spot in the conference as LMU and SCU are two of three teams currently tied for first place in the West Coast Conference. That duel will be followed by a meeting between the Lions and the San Diego Toreros on Saturday, Feb. 10, both games are scheduled for a 7 p.m. tipoff at Gersten Pavilion.

BRITTON NAMED WCC PLAYER OF THE WEEK...Junior guard Bryn Britton was named the West Coast Conference Player of the Week last week (Jan. 29). It was Britton's first Player of the Week award this year and the fourth of her career. Britton, a 5-11 native of Porterville, Calif., averaged 24.0 points, 6.0 rebounds, 3.5 assists, and 2.0 steals in two Lion victories two weeks ago. She exploded for 31 points and 7 rebounds against Saint Mary's, the first 30-point game in the WCC this year, as the Lions ended SMC's nine-game winning streak and defeated the Gaels for the first time since the 1992-93 season. Her points total set a new school record for most points scored by a junior in a single-game. In LMU's win over USF (Jan. 27), she notched 17 points, 5 rebounds, and 4 assists. Britton shot .452 (14-31) from the floor, .500 (6-12) from three, and .824 (14-17) from the foul line in the two games.

PROTECTING THE LIONS' DEN...The Lions are very protective of their home court as they have posted a 8-1 mark while playing at Gersten Pavilion this season. The Lions only home loss of the season came on Nov. 25, 2000 when dropped a 68-84 decision to No. 23 Xavier in the championship of the LMU • Furama Thanksgiving Classic. The Lions have not lost a game at home since then and are currently on a six-game home winning streak. The longest home win streak in LMU basketball history came during the 1992-93 season when the Lions rattled off 10 straight wins at Gersten Pavilion from Dec. 1, 1992-Jan. 30, 1993. The Lions are on the prowl and could match that mark playing their next four games at home.

THE SPARK CONTINUES...The Lions are roaring through the 2000-01 season and are off to one of the best starts in program history. LMU has won 11 of its last 13 games which includes a season-best six-game winning streak. LMU's streak, which tied a program-high for consecutive wins, began December 22 with an 89-56 win over Western Michigan at the Seattle Times Classic and continued with wins over Northern Arizona (66-51), Pittsburgh (74-57), No. 25 Utah (64-58), Long Beach State (75-61) and San Diego (74-70). The Lions saw their streak snapped after falling 75-84 at Santa Clara, but came back to record wins in their next three home games

against Pepperdine, Saint Mary's and San Francisco. LMU continued its winning ways on the road this past weekend bringing home victories from Portland and Gonzaga. Currently 6-2 in WCC action, the Lions are in a three-way tie for first-place in the conference. Santa Clara and Pepperdine also own a 6-2 record in league play. The last time LMU owned a 6-2 conference mark was during the 1989-90 season. Under the direction of then-head coach Todd Corman, the Lions started WCC play 6-2 before falling (60-72) at home against Saint Mary's.

BANKIN' ON BRITTON... Junior guard Bryn Britton scored a team-high 15 points in Thursday night's win at Portland. Among those 15 was a critical jumper that Britton nailed with just 22 seconds remaining in the game to give the Lions' their first ever win at Portland. She went 7-of-18 from the floor and was 1-for-6 from beyond the arc as she helped LMU win its third straight game. The following night at Gonzaga Britton dropped 16 points while dishing out a game-high six assists. She was near perfect from the free-throw line converting 6-of-7 attempts.

MURRAY EPITOMIZES CONSISTENCY... Look up the word consistent in the dictionary and you are likely to find a picture of LMU sophomore forward Kate Murray. She has had a break out season so far setting career-highs in almost every category. Murray, who has scored in double figures in 18 of the 21 games played this year, had a career-best game against No. 23 Xavier earlier this season. Against the Musketeers Murray connected on 11-of-18 from field, pulled down 11 rebounds, had five steals and dropped 23 points in 39 minutes, all career-highs. Her 18 games in double-digit points leads the team. Her three double-doubles on the year; Xavier - 11 rebounds, 23 points, Western Michigan - 10 rebounds, 13 points and Pittsburgh - 10 rebounds, 17 points is second only to freshman center Adrienne Slaughter who has five. Murray once again hit back-to-back double-digit point totals last weekend. She poured 12 points on Portland Thursday night and then dropped 13 points on Gonzaga Saturday night. Murray is currently averaging 13.0 points per game.

SLAUGHTER STANDS STRONG... Freshman center Adrienne Slaughter went to work against Gonzaga last Saturday night. The 6-2 native of Englewood, Colo. led the Lions to their fourth straight win as she matched career-highs in points and rebounds while also recorded her fifth career double-double. Slaughter enjoyed her first ever appearance at The Kennel as she highlighted LMU's offense with a game-high 20 points and also pulled down 16 boards. She recorded 20 points against Northern Arizona and pulled down 16 boards at No. 25 Utah earlier this season. Slaughter was just as impressive defensively as she collected five blocked shots on the weekend. She currently ranks second in the conference averaging 1.67 blocks per game. She has 35 total blocks on the year.

INJURY REPORT... The Lions will be without the services of sophomore center Shannon Wosman and junior guard Rosa Bernasconi the rest of the season. Both will sit out the remainder of the year due to ACL injuries suffered earlier this season. The Lions lost Wosman during the game at Santa Clara (Jan. 13) and then lost Bernasconi just six days later at Pepperdine (Jan. 20). They will undergo surgery as soon as possible and with rehab both look to be back in full force next year.

TERRIFIC TUESDAYS AND FANTASTIC FRIDAYS... If it was up to the Lions, the rest of the games this season would be played on a Tuesdays and Fridays. LMU is perfect 3-0 this season when playing on Tuesdays. Wins over San Diego State, Fresno State and No.25 Utah have made midweek games ideal for the Lions. LMU has also posted a perfect 4-0 mark when playing games on Fridays. Victories over Stony Brook, Western Michigan, Long Beach State and Saint Mary's have started the Lions' weekends off on the right note.

RECAPING PORTLAND... Bryn Britton hit a jumper with 22 seconds left to push the visiting LMU Lions past Portland 66-65 last Thursday night. The win continued a record breaking season for the Lions, as they earned a victory for the first time in school history at Portland. The Lions built a nine-point lead into the second half following a 36-29 lead at halftime. However, the Pilots led by two points with four and-a-half minutes to play. The lead was short lived, as a three-pointer from Raelen Self put the Lions up by one, followed by a layup from Adrienne Slaughter to push LMU's advantage to three. Portland's Sharon Rissmiller made a driving layup through 3 Lions players, and Khalila O'Rielly-Williams followed up with a layup of her own to put Portland back in the lead at 65-64. Britton then hit an eight-foot baseline jumper to put the Lions up 66-65, and Da'Love Woods' jumper did not fall to seal the game for LMU. Britton led five LMU players in double-figures, scoring 15 points and coming up with 3 steals. Freshman Adrienne Slaughter chipped in with 13 points, 7 rebounds, and three blocked shots. Also in double digits were Kate Murray with 12, Michele Brown with 11 and Taryn Reynolds with 10. The Lions shot 42% for the game on 26 of 62 shooting, and made just 20% of their three-point attempts to shoot 20% for the game.

RECAPING GONZAGA... The Loyola Marymount women's basketball team won its fourth consecutive game as it handed the Gonzaga Bulldogs a 62-58 loss last Saturday night in front of 804 at the Kennel in Spokane, Wash. Freshman center Adrienne Slaughter matched her career-high in points (20) and rebounds (16). The Lions improved to 15-6 overall and 6-2 in the West Coast Conference with the win. Gonzaga falls to 5-16 overall and 0-8 in WCC action. LMU has now won 11 of its last 13 games. Slaughter's double-double marked the fifth of her career. Junior guard Bryn Britton was the Lions' next high scorer with 16, she also dished out six assists on the night. Sophomore forward Kate Murray rounded out LMU's double-digit scorers. Her 13 points marked the 18th time this season she has hit double-digits in a game.

WILHOIT NAMED WCC COACH OF THE YEAR... Head Coach Julie Wilhoit captured the WCC Coach of the Year Award after guiding the Lions to their highest finish since 1990 last year. She is the first LMU women's basketball coach to earn the top coaching nod. Wilhoit is currently in her sixth season at the helm of the LMU women's basketball program. She was named the fourth head coach in the program's history on June 30, 1995. Wilhoit came to LMU after a two-year stint at the University of Pittsburgh-Bradford. With the Lions, she holds a 56-102 (.354) overall record and 23-61 (.274) record in West Coast Conference play. Wilhoit is in her 13th year as a head coach and owns a 177-172 (.507) overall record.

BRONCOS' BULLETS... Santa Clara enters this weekend tied for first in the WCC with LMU and Pepperdine. The Broncos own a 15-5 overall record and a 6-2 mark in league play. Annie Garrison is SCU's offensive leader. She is averaging 13.3 points and 8.0 rebounds per game, both totals lead the team. LMU is looking to revenge the loss (55-66) suffered at Santa Clara earlier this season (Jan. 13). Santa Clara holds a 27-6 series advantage over the Lions.

TOREROS TALK... San Diego is coming off a huge upset of Santa Clara last Saturday (64-63). The Toreros come to Los Angeles with an 8-11 overall record and a 3-5 mark in WCC action. Amber Jansen leads the squad with a 16.1 points per game average. She also leads the team averaging 7.4 rebounds per game. LMU is looking to sweep the series with USD for the first time since the 1998-99 season. The Lions opened league play this year with a 74-70 win at San Diego (Jan. 11). San Diego still holds the 24-12 series advantage.
