UP NEXT...The Loyola Marymount women's basketball team travels south to Long Beach, Calif. to round out the non-conference part of the 2000-2001 season. LMU will match up against The Beach at 7:30 p.m. in The Pyramid. Long Beach State is the Lions' final non-conference opponent before opening West Coast Conference action on the road next week in San Diego and Santa Clara.

LIONS TOPPLE TOP-25 TEAM...The Lions went on the road to record a huge upset victory, 64-58, at No.25 Utah last Tuesday night. The win marked the first ever victory over a ranked opponent for LMU. The Lions, who have won six of their last eight games, improved their season-high winning streak to four games.

ON A ROLL...LMU enters the game on a season-high four-game winning streak. After defeating Western Michigan, 89-56, in the consolation game of the Seattle Times Classic on Dec. 22, the Lions returned home to defeat Northern Arizona, 66-51, on Dec. 28 and Pittsburgh, 74-57, two days later. LMU then took its winning ways on the road pulling off a 64-58 upset at No.25 Utah. The Lions will be looking to win five in a row for the first time since it put together five straight wins in November and December of 1995, coach Julie Wilhoit's first season in Westchester.

CLEANING UP THE GLASS...The Lions' winning streak can be directly correlated to several things, most notably rebounding. LMU has owned the glass the last four games; out-rebounding opponents by an average of 46.5 to 31.5 in that span. Included in that was a season-high 59-rebound effort against Northern Arizona. That came on the heels of a 53-rebound game against Western Michigan. Against Pittsburgh, the Lions grabbed 22 rebounds in the second half to pull away from the Panthers while at No.25 Utah LMU out-boarded the Utes by a 37-27 margin.

MAKING HER POINT...After missing the first five games of the season with a broken hand, junior point guard Rosa Bernasconi has returned with a vengeance. Averaging 8.6 points and 4.1 assists per game, Bernasconi has seen her numbers improve with every game. Against Pittsburgh, she nearly turned in a triple-double, scoring 10 points, grabbing 10 rebounds and handing out 7 assists while making five steals in 38 minutes. It was her fourth career double-double. During the Lions' winning streak, she is averaging 8.8 points, 7.0 rebounds, four assists and 3.3 steals in 31.5 minutes per game.

CAREER GAMES...When a team gets hot, it is almost always due in large part to some impressive individual performances. The Lions' sweep of their recent two-game homestand was no exception. Against Northern Arizona, senior guard Taryn Reynolds picked up a career-high 10 rebounds while freshman center Adrienne Slaughter set career-highs in points (23) and blocks (6). In the next game, sophomore forward Kate Murray collected her third double-double of the season with 17 points and 10 rebounds.

DOUBLE HER PLEASURE...Since being held to nine points in the season-opener against San Diego State, sophomore forward Kate Murray has scored in double figures in every game. Her 11 games in double-figure points leads the team, followed by senior guard Taryn Reynolds' nine (including seven in a row to open the season) and junior guard Bryn Britton's nine.

IMMEDIATE IMPACT...A year ago, Adrienne Slaughter was a high schooler in Colorado. Now she is the pillar in the middle for LMU. A starter from the moment she got to Westchester, Slaughter set a school record for field-goal percentage in a game when she made all seven of her shots against Fresno State in her sixth career game on Dec. 5. Her best game came against Northern Arizona on Dec. 28 when she set career highs with 23 points, 11 rebounds and six blocks. The rebounding mark was not good enough for Slaughter as she set a new career rebounding high against No.25 Utah with 16.

TERRIFIC TUESDAYS AND FANTASTIC FRIDAYS...If it was up to the Lions, the rest of the games this season would be played on a Tuesdays and Fridays. LMU is perfect 3-0 this season when playing on Tuesdays. Wins over San Diego State, Fresno State and No.25 Utah have made mid-week games ideal for the Lions. LMU has also posted a perfect 2-0 mark when playing games on Fridays. Victories over Stony Brook and Western Michigan have started the Lions' weekends off on the right note.

RECAPING NORTHERN ARIZONA...Senior guard Taryn Reynolds picked up a career-high 10 rebounds and freshman center Adrienne Slaughter set career-highs with 23 points, 11 rebounds and six blocks as the Lions improved to 6-4 overall with a 66-51 win over the Lumberjacks (3-9) on Dec. 28 at Gersten Pavilion in Westchester. The Lions brought home the victory by winning the battle on the boards, out-rebounding the Lumberjacks, 59-35.

RECAPING PITTSBURGH...Junior guard Rosa Bernasconi recorded the fourth double-double of her career, tallying 10 points and 10 rebounds, and sophomore forward Kate Murray registered her third double-double with a game-high 17 points and 10 boards as the Lions beat the Panthers, 74-57, at LMU's Gersten Pavilion on Dec. 30. The Lions, who improved to 7-4 overall, came out firing and took a quick 11-4 lead, forcing a quick Pittsburgh timeout. Following the stop in play, the Panthers turned up the heat with a full court press and went on an 8-2 run, cutting the Lion lead to 13-12. One point would be as close as the Panthers (6-6) would come all game though as LMU never relinquished its lead.

RECAPING NO.25 UTAH...Freshman center Adrienne Slaughter had 15 points and a career-high 16 rebounds for Loyola Marymount, which was strong off the boards throughout while upsetting No. 25 Utah 64-58 Tuesday night. The Utes (11-2) pulled within 59-52 with 1:48 left following a 9-2 run, but their chances to extend the rally vanished when Slaughter tipped in an inbounds pass as the shot clock expired on the ensuing possession. After taking a 29-24 lead at halftime, the Lions (8-4) started the second half with an 11-2 run that gave them a double-figures lead Utah was not able to overcome. LMU was further able to negate Utah's defense by converting 14 offensive rebounds into a 15-7 advantage in second-chance points. Sophomore forward Kate Murray added 18 points, while junior guard Bryn Britton chipped in 15 points, eight boards and three assists. Senior guard Taryn Reynolds came just one steal shy of tying her career mark of seven in a game; she had six steals on the night to compliment an eight-point, three rebound performance.

WILHOIT NAMED WCC COACH OF THE YEAR...Head Coach Julie Wilhoit captured the WCC Coach of the Year Award after guiding the Lions to their highest finish since 1990 last year. She is the first LMU women's basketball coach to earn the top coaching nod. Wilhoit is currently in her sixth season at the helm of the LMU women's basketball program. She was named the fourth head coach in the program's history on June 30, 1995. Wilhoit came to LMU after a two-year stint at the University of Pittsburgh-Bradford. With the Lions, she holds a 49-100 (.329) overall record and 17-59 (.239) record in West Coast Conference play. Wilhoit is in her 13th year as a head coach and owns a 170-170 (.450) overall record.

A DAY AT THE BEACH...The Lions look to win their fifth in a row when they take on Long Beach State on Friday. The Beach currently owns a 5-7 overall mark but boasts a 3-1 record when on its home court. Jackie Moore is leading Long Beach's offensive front with an 18.1 point per game average. She is shooting .519 from the field (81-156) and .598 (55-92) from the charity stripe. Moore also leads LBS in the rebounding department. She has collected 100 rebounds on the season and is averaging 8.3 boards per game. The Lions and The Beach have met on four prior occasions. Long Beach owns a 3-1 series advantage with LMU recording a win (67-64) during the two programs last meeting on Dec. 5, 1997.
