THIS WEEK - The No.10-ranked Lions travel north face Santa Clara, top-ranked Stanford and San Jose State this weekend. The Santa Clara Broncos are the only unranked team that the Lions will face the remainder of the season. The Stanford Cardinal is ranked No. 1 in the nation currently while the San Jose State Spartans are No. 9.

BRIEFLY - The 10th-ranked Lions had a successful outing in the first tournament to be held at the Burns Recreation Center pool. LMU went undefeated on the weekend improving its mark to 15-4 overall.

TOURNAMENT REVIEW -

vs No.11 UC SAN DIEGO -- The 9th-ranked Loyola Marymount women's water polo team defeated No. 11 UC San Diego, 4-3, in overtime last Friday afternoon at the Burns Recreation Center Pool. Freshman Jaime Kroeze put in the game-winning goal with just four seconds remaining in the first overtime period. The Lions went on the board first when senior Cara Schindler found the back of the net at the 3:25 mark of the first period. The Tritons tied things up in the second quarter with a goal from junior Emma Kudritzki. With under a minute to go in the half it looked as though the score would be tied 1-1 before LMU freshman Teresa Guidi put the Lions up 2-1 going into the half (0:41). The lead didn't last long as UCSD took advantage of a 6-on-5 situation in the third quarter. The Tritons knotted the score once again at 2-2 on a goal

by Kudritzki, her second of the day. Both teams posted goals in the fourth quarter sending the game into overtime tied at 3-3. LMU's Lucy Windes scored on a penalty shot while Dana Tucker tied the game for the Tritons. LMU held UCSD scoreless through both overtime periods and was lifted to the victory by Kroeze's goal with 0:04 remaining in the first overtime.

vs **REDLANDS** -- LMU cruised to an 8-3 win over Redlands, scoring the first seven goals of the game. Schindler again opened the Lion scoring attack, while freshman Teresa Guidi added three first half goals. In addition, senior Danielle Worrill found the back of the cage twice during the second half. Redlands got on the scoreboard with 1:48 left in the third quarter, and then mounted a spirited mini-rally by scoring the game's final two goals. Senior Katie Reichert led the Bulldogs with two scores.

vs. **No.12 UC DAVIS** -- The ninth-ranked Lions wrapped up play with a 6-4 victory over No. 12 UC Davis. LMU never trailed in the contest, building a 2-0 first quarter lead on goals from senior Cara Schindler and junior Lucy Windes, who led all players with three scores. The Aggies made things interesting by pulling within one goal on three separate occasions, the last coming on a wrap-around shot by senior Kim Parker to pull her team within 5-4 at the 1:51 mark of the fourth quarter. However Loyola Marymount junior Merideth Bellotti scored an insurance score with just 25 seconds remaining in the game, finding the back of the cage from long range.

GAME 4 vs. No.12 UC SAN DIEGO -- UCSD took a 1-0 lead in the first quarter, but Julia Wald's two second -period goals gave the Lions a 2-1 advantage at the half. Both teams were unable to record a goal in the third period, however, UCSD's S. Silverman scored with 2:51 left in regulation, sending the game into overtime. UC San Diego outscored the Lions, 2-1, in the extra period to win the game, 6-5.

FROM THE STATS SHEET - Junior Lucy Windes currently leads the team with 40 goals. She is LMU's all-time goals leader with 164 in her career. Behind Windes in goals scored is freshman Teresa Guidi with 23. Guidi is just as effective defensively as she leads the team with 37 steals to date. Goalkeeper Devon Courtney has been as stingy as ever when it comes to guarding the net. Courtney, a junior, has started all 19 games, made 107 saves and has allowed her opponents just 72 points on the year.
